

Former Sandy Man Assigned Burma Position

Announcement has been made by the Department of the Air



Force of the assignment of Lt. Col. Carl W. Stucki to the American Embassy at Rangoon, Burma as the Air Force's Senior Advisor to the Burmese Air Force. Colonel Stucki will be departing for the assignment during August.

As Advisor to the Burmese Air Force, Colonel Stucki will be the representative of the Department of Defense to Burma and will function through the American Ambassador there. He will provide guidance in matters concerned with military grant - aid, sales of aeronautical equipment, and selection of Burmese Air Force personnel for courses of training in the United States as well as guidance to the Burmese in operating and maintaining their military aircraft.

Since departure in 1964 from the State University of Iowa, where he was the Associate Professor of Air Science for four years, Colonel Stucki has undergone preparatory studies for the assignment including the Air War College course at Montgomery, Alabama, completion of requirements for a Master of Science degree in International Affairs at the George Washington University, and a month of briefings at the Military Assistance Institute at Arlington, Va.

Stucki is the son of Mr. and Mrs. G. Stucki of Tygh Valley, Oregon, formerly of Sandy, Oregon, and Mrs. Stucki is the former Manerva McMillen, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. A.
