Sun Valley Herd High On DIHA List

Listed among the top four high producing dairy herds in Clackamas County for the month of September is Sun Valley Dairy in Boring. The locally owned dairy herd was included in the monthly reports of Berney and Mattison of the Dairy Herd Improvement Assn.

Sun Valley Dairy has a herd of 75 cows averaging 41 pounds of butterfat during the month. Seven cows were listed as dry.

Among individual cows recorded by DIHA supervisors for producing outstanding records of 75 pounds of butterfat or more during the same period were two registered Brown Swiss and one Brown Swiss owned by Meter Dairy of Boring. Also on the list was a registered Holstein and one other Holstein owned by Sun Valley Dairy.
