

OC Posts Easy 77-52 Victory Over Sandyites

Winless Sandy took another one on the chin last Thursday night as an aggressive Oregon City quintet poured 77 points through the hoop to garner an easy 77-52 victory on the Sandy basketball court. The loss was the fourth straight for the locals.

A non-league encounter, the TTV league member took command in the opening quarter and coasted to the victory using mostly reserves in the final half of the contest. The halftime score was 40-28.

Pacing the Pioneers from Sandy in the scoring column was Jack Scales with a 23 point output. It was the second time this season that Scales had poured more than 20 points through the hoop.

A reserve center, Larry Quigley, led the scoring attack for the visitors with 16 counters.

Low Logging Co. Gets Timber Bid

R. P. Sorber, Lakes District Ranger, Mt. Hood National Forest, reports that Low Logging Company of Sandy was declared high bidder of the Winn Road Blowdown Timber Sale.

This timber sale, part of the Lakes District's small sales program, consists of 20 thousand board feet of Douglas-fir and 30 thousand board feet of Western hemlock and other species. The Douglas-fir, which was advertised for \$40.20 per thousand board feet, was sold for \$65.00 per thousand. The Western hemlock and other species was sold for the advertised price of \$15.15. Included in the stumpage price was \$3.00 for slash disposal.

Those who attended the timber sale were Low Logging Company, K. L. Woods Logging Company, and Alford Logging Company.

The purpose of this sale is to salvage windthrown timber before it is destroyed by insects and disease.

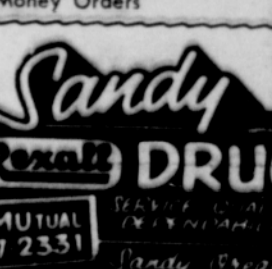
