It Happened in MAY

May 6--Five year old Lee Anna Martin of Boring was struck and killed in front of her home on Reynolds road in a car tragedy late Thursday afternoon of last week. She was hit by a car driven by Ralph A Hudson of Boring.

Voters in the various school district of the area approved five of six school budgets on the ballots Monday. Passed were budgets for Sandy Union High School District No. 2, Sandy Elementary School District No. 46, Bull Run School District No. 45, Welches School District No. 13, and Dover School No. 83. Only at Cottrell School District No. 107 was a "thumbs down" response to budget requests given by voters.

Two local lasses, Helen L. Decker and Lynda K. Belcher, were named today as valedictorian and salutatorian of the graduating senior class at Sandy Union High School. Miss Decker has maintained a 4.0 gpa while Miss Belcher has a 3.98 gpa for her four years of high school.

Practice for the summer baseball program here will get underway this week according to Jim Martin, Sandy co-ordinator.

May 13--Sandy Elementary School District No. 46 Attorney Paul Biggs was instructed Monday night to draw up a resolution and present it at the next board meeting for a bond election for more classrooms and a municipal swimming pool under the jurisdiction of the local district.

Mt. Hood Jaycees and Jayettes held a joint installation at the Mt. Hood Country club last Saturday night. Installed as president of the Jaycees was Jerry Perkins. Other Jaycee officer installed were Denny Gray as vice president; Leroy

Russell as secretary; Jim Pullen as treasurer; Sam Gray as club director; and Garrett Hartke as a state director. Jayettes' new president is Gwen Pullen with other club officers installed being Sue Perkins as vice president; Phyllis Stavros as club secretary; Sally Russell as treasurer; and Joyce Martin as club parliamentarian.

May 20--An all-night graduation party and feed for Sandy High School senior class of 1965 will be held in Sandy on June 3 through the cooperation of merchants of the Sandy area.

Graduation exercise for the eighth grade students at Sandy Grade School will be held at the school gym at 8 p.m. Tuesday, May 25. A class of 105 students will take part.

Mrs. G. Zimmerman of Boring was re-elected president of the Clackamas County 4-H Leaders Association.

Five eighth grade students will become the final students to graduate from the Dover Grade School. The school will merge with Sandy Elementary School District No. 46 on July 1 of this year.

Work already initiated toward restoration of river channel and removal of flood debris on the Sandy River and its tributaries in the Mt. Hood Area will be completed by about May 26 according to Colonel William J. Talbot, Portland U.S. Army District Engineer.

May 27--Plans have been submitted for a possible solution to the Vine Maple Bridge controversy. The bridge was destroyed in the Christmas week floods and has cut off the most direct route into Rhododendron for residents in the Vine Maple, Still Creek and Cool Creek areas.

June 3 -- A summer work program under the Economic Opportunity Act, specifically known as the Neighborhood Youth Corps, was applied for recently by Sandy high school. The application requested commencement on June 14.

A fatal heart attack Monday claimed the life of John D. Griffith, 57, a teacher at Sandy grade school for the past eight years.

Mike Spring was installed Tuesday evening as new post commander of Sandy Post No. 127 of the American Legion in ceremonies conducted at the Odd Fellows Hall here.

June 10 -- The Hoodland Telephone Co. revealed today its plans for a major expansion and improvement program. Charles Augustine, company owner, made the announcement.

A request presented to the city's planning commission on behalf of an unnamed investment corporation to improve property located in the center of the Sandy business district was granted by the commission. Location of the site is the vacant block bounded by First and Second Sts. and Proctor and Main. Proposal is for an integrated shopping center.

A hearing has been set for June 15 at Welches Grade School regarding a complaint against Hoodland Telephone Co. The state public utilities commission will conduct the hearing.

A logging truck containing three huge logs tipped over spilling its load Monday morning at the Estacada intersection in Sandy.

A nearly packed gymnasium observed graduation ceremonies conducted last Thurs-

day night here. Diplomas were received by 131 students.

By a vote of nearly five to one voters approved the creation of an East Side Area Education (Community College) District in a special election last Thursday. The vote was 3,824 'yes' and 837 'no'. Capt. L.S. Hartman barely missed out in his bid for a board seat.

June 17--The establishment of a Neighborhood Youth Corps project for Sandy during the summer was granted last week by Labor Secretary Willard Wirtz. A number of local youths will be provided with summer jobs here through this program.

The Zig Zag District Ranger, Pete Wingle, announced Monday that the Forest Service plans to replace the Vine Maple Bridge across the Zig Zag River. Plans are being prepared to construct a single lane medium duty structure of a permanent type.

Hoodland Telephone Company entered into a time-table agreement with the State Public Utilities Commission and Portland General Electric Co. in the course of the public hearing held Tuesday at Wemina.

June 24--Directors of the East Side Community College met last Thursday evening and appointed Capt. L.S. Hartman of Sandy as administrative assistant for the new institution. Hartman was a candidate from Sandy for the board of directors.

Heavy construction equipment moved into Sandy on Monday of this week and crews began digging up Main Street from the intersection of the Loop Highway west.

A Portland architect, Richard E. Ritz, remarked at

last Thursday's Kiwanis meeting that the city is at new crossroads with the four-lane highway right through town about to be built. He discussed various aspects of town development while here.

Sandy's high school foreign exchange student, Piercarlo Moretti, leaves today for a tour of the United States and then on to his Italian home in Torino, Italy. While attending Sandy High he has lived with the Warren Harding family.

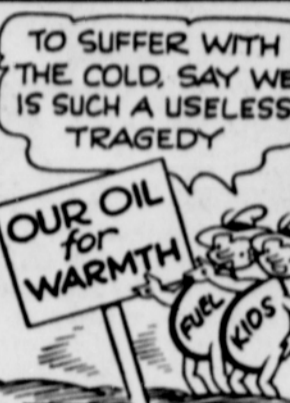

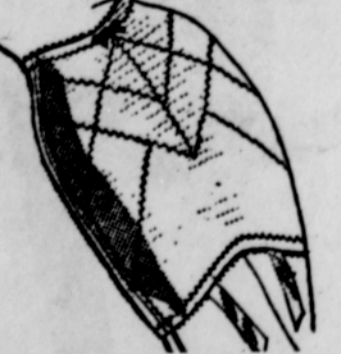
