

Towering Cougars Blast Locals 77-44

Using an effective zone defense the Canby Cougars held Sandy to 44 points and went on to trounce the Pioneers 77-44 in Wilco league action Tuesday night. The contest was played at Canby.

The tallest team in the conference the Cougars got off to a quick start and never let up Tuesday. Before the locals could get accustomed to the towering height and effective zone played against them, the first quarter of action was over and they were trailing by ten points. The first quarter ended at 15-5 in favor of Canby.

Sandy's fortunes in outside shooting, which was required against the Cougar defense, improved in the second and third stanzas. The team fell behind by another four points and were trailing by a count

of 33-19 when the half ended. The third quarter found them scoring 16 points while Canby scored 18 points.

It was a different story again in the final period, however, as Canby poured in several counters while holding the Pioneers to a meager nine point effort.

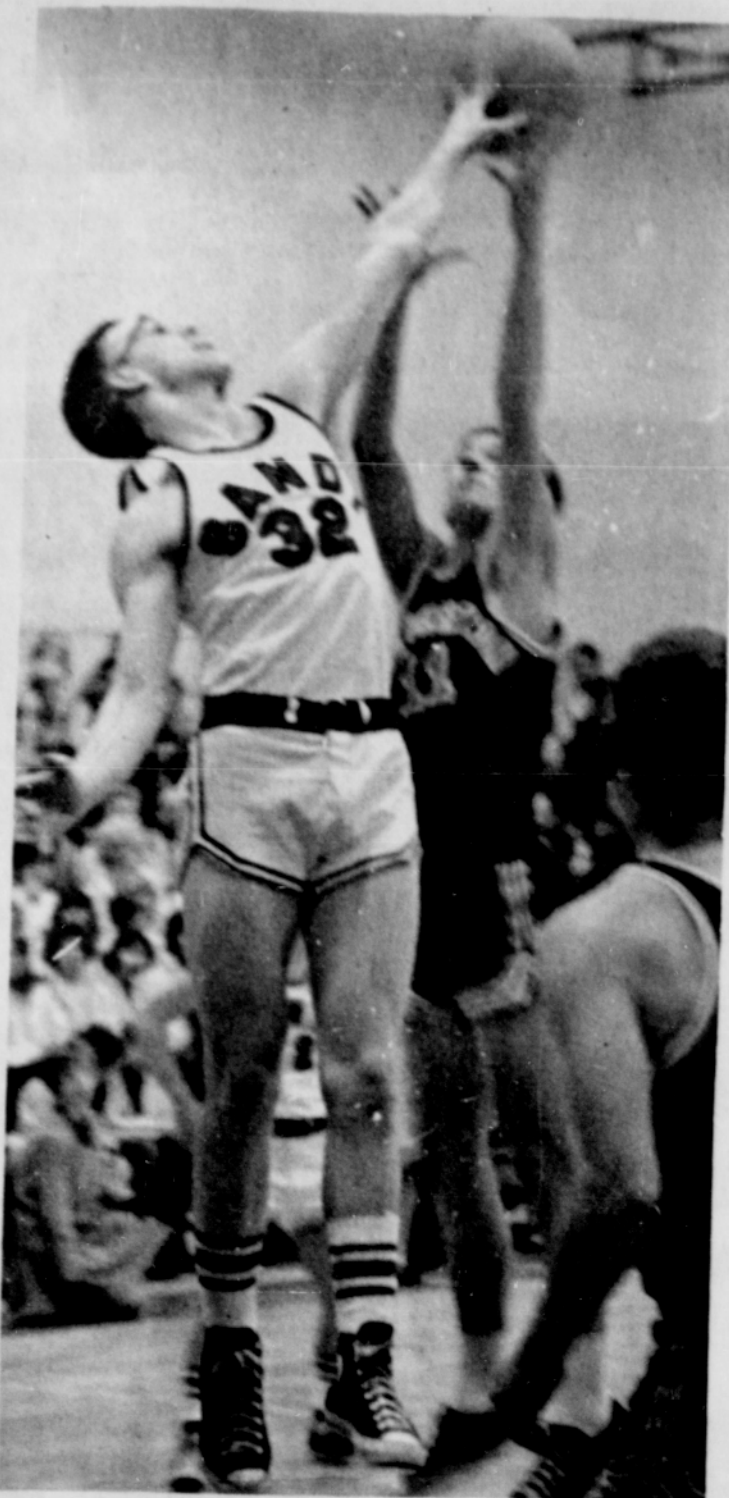

Sandy Edges Foxes

The Pioneers of Sandy went into a stall with two minutes and 48 seconds remaining in the contest against Silverton Friday night and eked out a narrow 39-36 victory. It was the second Wilco conference win for the Pioneers this season.

With a scant one point edge the Pioneers employed their stalling tactics that nearly backfired when Jack Scales missed his free throw attempt and Silverton recovered the rebound. At this point only 26 seconds was left to play and Silverton's Curt McBride missed his shooting attempt and a foul was called on him in the process. With four seconds to go Ron Verdoorn missed his charity throw and Stan Dobson tipped in the rebound for Sandy's clincher before the buzzer sounded.

Sandy jumped to an early lead in the game but the battling Foxes of Silverton kept coming back to stay within catching distance of the locals. The first quarter ended with Sandy ahead by a 11-8 count. Midway through the second quarter Silverton had difficulty finding the hoop and Coach Nick Robertson's hoopers from Sandy begin to pull slowly away from them. At one time the Pioneers held an eleven point lead

and by the end of the half the score was 25-16.

For the most part during the third stanza the two teams were exchanging buckets in a contest that definitely took on the appearance of a low scoring affair. In the latter minutes, however, the Foxes suddenly found the mark and a final lay-in just before the horn sounded pulled them to within four points of Sandy. The third quarter score being 33-29.

Scoring in the final period was even slower as the minutes ticked by and neither team produced a scoring punch. Yet, as the quarter neared the last three minutes the excitement of the spectators warmed, McBride of Silverton slipped past the Sandy defense and pumped a lay-in through to put the score at 37-36.

Immediately the Pioneers employed their stalling offense and managed to hold off the visitors as they emerged victors.
