in Clyde Park and Olmsted, Mont.

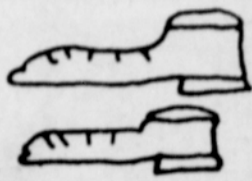

Pioneer Days

In looking over Mrs. Maggie Thomas's scrap book, I found a picture of the old Meinig building, the original one. In the olden days this building served the community as post-office, general store and saloon. It was built in 1893 by F. A. Meinig who came to Sandy as one of the first settlers.

The first location of this building was near the fork in the Loop Highway at the east end of Sandy. In 1911 it was moved to its location across from the Meinig Store which was destroyed by a fire a few years ago.

Such stories that old building could have told. I remember my late husband telling about the time when some wrong doer or he at least was deemed a wrong doer, dodged into this building to escape his hot eyed pursuer. Rushing into the back of the store he just had time to crouch behind a counter piled high with overalls.

Hot on his heels was his enemy brandishing a gun which he fired blindly where he thought the one who had done him wrong, had hidden. Happily for the hunted one the pile of overalls deflected the bullet but to Mr. Meinig's chagrin every pair had a bullet hole in it. I suppose by that time the battle shifted elsewhere.

The upper floor of the building was used as a dance hall and I can remember going there to dances, the good old fashioned kind, the waltz, the polka, the two step and square dance.

One time in particular I recall, the very first time I ever attended a dance in Oregon after arriving in Oregon, I was teaching and boarding seven miles from Sandy but on one Saturday night, the horses were hitched up and with the three grown sons of the family we drove to Sandy over the rough corduroy road. I don't remember whether it was raining but it could have been and we were in an uncovered hack.

The dance lasted most of the night and it was 7 o'clock in the morning before we reached the home place. But such goings

Estacada Phone Company to Poll Subscribers on Extended Service

Officials of the Estacada Telephone Company have been directed to poll their telephone users on the desirability of extended area service. The extended area to be serviced would include toll free calls to Portland, Milwaukee and Oak Grove.

If subscribers to the local facilities service poll an affirmative vote it would mean an increase in the basic telephone charge. This upcharge would only be 50 cents per month in some cases depending on where a novelty to me but it was fun.
