Pioneer Days

In looking over the pages of the scrap book I came across the name Bacon which had an old familiar ring. Wasn't it Frances Bacon who has often been accused of doing Shakespeare's literary chores long ago?

Well, the Bacon in the scrap book wasn't that long ago, but he, Samuel Bacon was one of Oregon's pioneers. He came to Oregon in 1871 from his native state of Illinois. In 1876 he married Mary Wilson and since his bride was only twelve years old and Oregon laws did not permit such a child to be united in the hold bonds of matrimony the couple had to go to Vancouver, Washington for the ceremony. So with their witnesses they set out in a wagon for their long journey through the dense forest to Portland and beyond and they had to be ferried across the river to Vancouver.

I remember talking to Mrs. Bacon. She said "I was still playing with dolls when I was married." Her husband was at least sixteen years older than she, I wonder that her father and mother, John and Martha Wilson permitted the marriage but I suppose after a meager schooling which she had had in the little log Revenue school, marriage was all that was left for her.

The couple settled down near Bull Run where they lived for fifty four years. They had a hard life and few comforts. Frank Bacon, a son who formerly lived at the dam, told me once that he was born on a bear rug in front of their fireplace with no one in attendance.

Before Mr. Bacon died he expressed a wish to be buried on his own land so his wishes were carried out and a short time afterwards the community decided that it would be well to have their own cemetery so a plot of land surrounding Mr. Bacon's grave was purchased from the widow for \$2.50. This plot is now the beautiful little Cliffside Cemetery. The story is that a Bull Run teacher suggested the name Cliffside.

Mrs. Bacon was a cheery soul and was always on hand in times of illness. In fact when my husband George Ten Eyck was born, she was there to help so later she was able to sign his birth certificate.
