Court Fines Man For Trail Riding

The Forest Service has won a test case which questioned the legality of an order by the Regional Forester under the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Regulation U-6, banning motorized travel in a non-classified area.

A Eugene man, Howard E. Shirley, was tried Feb. 11 in the U. S. District Court at Portland and found guilty of riding a motorcycle in the Waldo Lake Recreational Area of the Willamette National Forest. Judge Gus J. Solomon upheld the reasonableness of the order by Regional Forester Stone in closing the trail to motorized travel.

Shirley, President of the Western Motorized, Inc., deliberately rode his motorcycle on the Maiden Peak Trail last July 25 to test the closure order's legality. Judge Solomon meted a \$250 fine, later reduced to \$100 and sentenced the defendant to 30 days in jail. The jail sentence was suspended and Shirley was placed on probation for a year, under condition that he not violate the regulation again. Shirley's attorney indicated that the case would not be appealed.
