



Pioneers Drop Cage Tilt 48-44

Canby's tall Cougars scored a 48-44 basketball win over the luckless Sandy Pioneers Tuesday night in Wilco league play on the Pioneer home court. Sandy jumped into an early lead in the first quarter, but the Cougars quickly proved their superiority on the backboards, and took a 10-6 first quarter lead. In the second frame, neither team showed a hot hand, Canby getting 9 points, Sandy 7.

The Pioneers warmed up considerably in the third stanza, and led 34-32 as the final quarter got under way. Canby's Yoder proved too much for the

Pioneers, who came back strong in the fourth quarter to regain the lead and outscore Sandy 16-10. Final count Canby 48, Sandy 44. Scales of Sandy led the scoring with 14 points. For Canby, Yoder scored 13, Verdoorn had 11 points for the Pioneers, Jackley 9, Williams 6, Poppenhagen 2, Dobson 2.

The Pioneers play their last home - game Friday night against the Crusaders of Jesuit high school.

Sled Dog Racers Praise Hood Meet

The Mt. Hood Race sponsored by the Cascade Sled Dog Club on Feb. 12 and 13 drew entries from a dozen communities, and proved to be one of the most successful races yet held by the club.

The dog sled teams began arriving on the mountain Friday evening, Feb. 11 -- from Waterville, Everett, Seattle and Woodville in Washington, -- from Jefferson, Sisters, Salem, Milwaukie, Medford, Siletz and Sandy in Oregon, and from as far away as Priest River in Idaho.

Due to heavy snow conditions, the races were transferred from Frog Lake, as previously scheduled, to the Lolo Pass area. The Cascade Sled Dog Club expressed its appreciation to the many individuals who assisted, and mentioned in particular, "The State Highway Department kept the Frog Lake area plowed perfectly and the highways cleared. Jole Smith, of Jole's Ski Shop at Rhododendron, spent Saturday and Sunday at the Lolo Pass race site plowing out the area with her snowcat. The Bear Spring Rangers and the Zig Zag rangers gave us invaluable assistance throughout. We would also like to thank the Sno-Line Motel where many of us had accommodations, and the Log Lodge for their dining facilities."

Mrs. Velma Wade, of Sandy, a member of the Cascade Sled Dog Club, added, "We especially want to thank the Sandy Lions Club for their concession which was open on Saturday and Sunday. They did a wonderful job. They had to rush to finish painting their new chuckwagon in time, and some of the inside paint was still drying Saturday."

The Class A, Class B and Class C Races were held Saturday and Sunday; the same course being run both days, and the total miles and combined times determining the winners.

Winner of the Class A Race was Art Christensen, of Jefferson, Oregon. His 5-dog sled team finished the 20 - mile course specified in 1 hour, 18 minutes and 37 seconds.

Dwight Dinsmore, of Jun-tura, Oregon, took first place in the 14 Mile Class B race. His team, consisting of 8 dogs, (4 siberians and 4 setters) was clocked over the double seven-mile course for a combined time of 57 min. 14 seconds.

The Class C Race was won by Karen Dinsmore, the wife



of the Class B Race winner. Karen finished the course in 51 min. 14 seconds, with her 3 dog siberian team. At the finish, she mentioned that "I am tired of running with only 3 dogs. I am going to get more dogs, so I won't have to run!"

She was one of the winners of a dog at the race -- Mr. and Mrs. Harry Wade of Sandy, gave 3 registered siberian 8-month old puppies to the winners of the Class A, Class B and Class C divisions.

The teams entered varied in the number of dogs used. The Class A event found Art Christensen using a 5-dog team, while Jim Keller of Sisters, Oregon, used a 10-dog team.

In the Pee Wee Race which is open to all youngsters between the ages of 3 and 8 years, another member of the Dinsmore family walked away with first place honors. Todd Dinsmore was declared winner. This race is limited to the use of one dog.

"Frosty", a Malemute, owned by Dick Wooten of Medford, pulled 1300 lbs. to win the Weight Pull contest.

Sandy's sole entry was Harry and Velma Wade's 5 dog registered team.

The well-known dog trainer, Dave Elizares, and his family, were among those at the Mt. Hood Race. Elizares holds dog

training classes in Portland, and is frequently seen on television with his german shepherd dogs. His young daughter, an early enthusiast, was so thrilled to learn that she could ride the sled, that her family had a hard time keeping her out of it until race time. Another family group seen enjoying the Sunday race was Kaare and Alice Nielsen with their five children.

The last Sled Dog Race of the year will be held this weekend at Bend. The race is sponsored by the Eastern Oregon College of Education and will be located in the Spring River area. The public is cordially invited.
