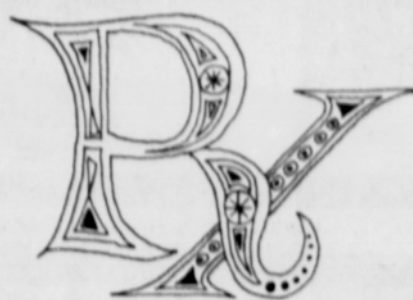
Dinner Honors David Russells
