



1965 Co-op Sales Hit New Record

A break-through to the "half-million dollar club" for 1965 sales volume was scored by the Gresham Cooperative, according to figures released at the 32nd annual meeting at the Gresham Grange Hall on the evening of March 8.

Manager R. H. (Dick) Wilcox disclosed figures showing that several all-time operating records were established by the Co-op in 1965.

Included were: net margins, \$28,542.70 after dividends on stock; reduced receivables, 12 working days' sales; and the new record in sales for the year of \$513,337.33 -- up 14.5 per cent from the previous year.

A new agricultural lime warehouse at Woodburn went into operation in 1965 that will supplement those already established at Fairview and Forest Grove, Wilcox said. Total tonnage of lime spread last year reached a new high of 180 carloads or about 11,000 tons.

General farm supplies sold at the store is still the Co-op's leading department. Sales total here were about \$250,000.

Tax Limitation Debate Due at Farm Union Meet

The proposed 1 1/2% tax limitation will be the subject of debate at the Kelso Farm Union meeting on Wednesday, March 23. Cyril Chambers, Molalla farmer, will speak for the affirmative, while State Senator Tom Monaghan will present the negative side of the issue.

The petroleum bulk plant had about \$100,000 in sales volume for the year.

Plans for the new Co-op store building on property owned east of Gresham on Hogan Road are now well advanced, according to the report, with construction expected to be under way by late 1967.

Manager Wilcox delighted the crowd with his goodnatured ribbing of employees in their various misadventures in the line

of duty. He pointed out that the staff of six basic employees now handled \$150,000 in added sales volume in recent years with "undiminished efficiency."

Guest speaker was Jens F. Svith, agronomist from the Oregon state highway department. He demonstrated by color slides how the beautification and erosion control staff cared for some 12,000 acres of roadside improvements, parks and

tourist facilities throughout the state.

In the election of directors, William Strebin and Jack Ickler, both Route 2, Troutdale, were returned to the board for terms of three years. H. D. (Duane) Mohr, Route 1, Troutdale was elected to succeed Oscar Brue, who had served his limit of two successive terms. Brue was tendered a special wall plaque in recognition of his service.

The Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults has opened its annual Easter Seal sale, proceeds from which finance a multiplicity of projects throughout the state, according to Mrs. Franklin Terrill, county chairman.

Among Easter Seal programs are Children's Hospital School in Eugene, where youngsters from more than 20 Oregon counties receive physical, occupational and speech therapy as well as regular schooling. Camp Easter Seal near Reedsport, Oregon's only summer camp exclusively designed for handicapped children and young adults. Three mobile therapy clinics which travel to virtually every section of Oregon, bringing physical therapy to areas where such therapy is not readily available, or to patients who are needy.

When asked "Why give?", Mrs. Terrill said "Because contribution helps make this splendid program possible, and because you'll feel a deep personal satisfaction when you give to a dedicated organization like the Easter Seal Society."
