

Orient Gets Physical, Health Program Funds

Austin E. Haddock, director Title I, Public Law 89-10, has informed Orient grade school that its second project under the Federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act has been approved.

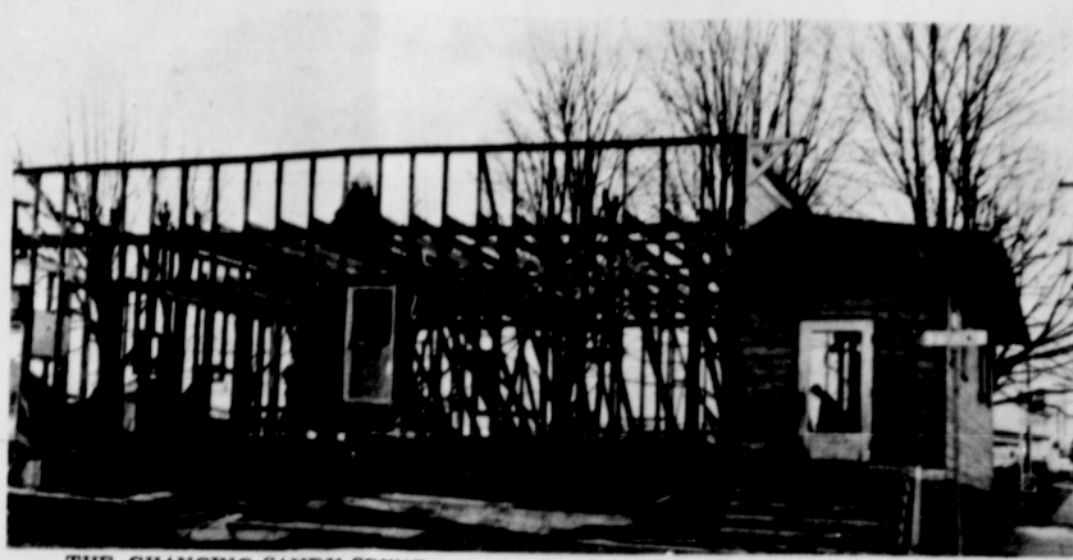
Mauro F. Potestio, principal of East Orient school, and the district director and representative for the federal legislation, announced that the second project has been designed to improve the physical health and education of several of the students presently enrolled in Orient schools.

To facilitate this newly designed project, the Federal government has made available to Orient school a sum of \$7,284 in addition to the first allocation of \$19,329. Part of this new grant will go to pay for the expense of adding a physical education and health teacher to the staff, and secondly it will provide money toward the purchase of gym equipment.

Willie Chang, a recent graduate of Linfield college, is the new physical education and health teacher for Orient schools. This marks the first time that Orient school has been staffed with full time physical education and health teachers for both the boys and girls. Mrs. Jean Russell's schedule has been altered so that she now teaches all physical education and health to the girls.

Ralph Dyson, consultant on Health and Physical Education for the State of Oregon, spent March 22 on the Orient premises evaluating the present program and offering suggestions as to how best to utilize the additional member to the staff.

The entire project, according to Potestio, is for the promotion and development of good health, healthful practices, and the progression toward physical maturation among the educationally and economically deprived. Potestio added further that, under qualified instructors, the Orient District wishes to provide a definite and functional medium of education for the deprived, aimed at the physical development of their bodies, and also to develop their social, emotional, and mental capacities to the optimum.
