NOTICE HEREBY IS GIVEN That at the East Side Area Education District Special Election called to be held within said district on the 21st day of April, A. D. 1966, between the hours of 2 p.m. and 8 p.m., there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the following proposal copied from the ballot title and text of the proposed measure as the same will be printed on the official ballot:

EAST SIDE AREA EDUCATION DISTRICT SPECIAL TAX LEVY FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONAL FUNDS -- PROPOSAL:

For the reason that all sources of revenue other than a special tax levy will fail to meet the minimum financial requirements of East Side Area Education District (Mt. Hood Community College) for the 1966-67 fiscal year and a special tax levy in the amount of \$496,376 is necessary to meet such minimum financial requirements, shall East Side Area Education District, in order to provide funds for the maintenance and operation of the district, make a special levy, which shall be outside the limitation imposed by Article XI, Section II, of the Oregon Constitution, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1966, in the amount of \$496,376?

County Gets Park Funds

Clackamas county has received a notice from the state highway department allocating \$20,409.59 for matching money. The money is from boat gas tax refunds and the county will act as a clearing house for all project applications.

The funds will be matched by the city or county and could be matched by federal funds also. An example would be \$1,000 of city money, \$1,000 of marine facility money, and this could be matched by \$2,000 of land and water conservation funds for a total project of \$4,000 and the local government would only invest 25 cents for each dollar toward the project. This, of course, is predicted upon the approval of the proposed project by the interested agencies.

A notice of intent to use the money must be filed by the interested governmental agencies within 60 days of receipt of the letter from the state highway department which was April 1, 1966. Further, the actual project application must be on file before Sept. 1, 1966 or the money will be returned to the state and redivided amongst those counties interested in utilizing these funds.

The County Park department has notified the eligible cities that there will be a meeting of each of the city representatives and the County Park advisory board to establish a list of priority projects. This meeting will be held in the Clackamas county court house in Room 201 at 8 p.m., April 11.

At the same time there will be a meeting with all of the cities to determine a list of priorities for the land and water conservation fund projects. The funds are administered by the State Park department. The state is retaining 60 per cent of the federal bureau of outdoor recreation money for their matching funds and allocating 40 per cent to the counties, cities and park districts. Each of the local government agencies is eligible. If your city does not have a project, the joint board of the cities and county would appreciate a representative from your city to help determine which projects
