Congressman Wendell Wyatt (R-Ore.) announced in Washington Monday that he had completed arrangements for mailing his annual questionnaire to his constituents.

Wyatt said that approximately 150,000 would be mailed to every postal patron in this congressional district in about two weeks.

"This is the best way I have found to sample the thoughts of my constituents," Wyatt said.

"The returns on the questionnaire are of substantial value to me in forming my judgment on issues of great importance to our state and nation," he said.

Last year, Wyatt reported, over 20% of the questionnaires sent out were returned.
