Had such a good visit with Lydia Koennecke in her so pleasant Portland home. We had a lively time with old reminiscences of by-gone days when our children attended the old Sandy school.

Many will remember the four room square seat of education. It veered to the west in a slightly tipsy manner from its position close to the highway. Inside was a hall across the entire front which always bore an order of stale food as the school children kept their lunch pails on shelves along the walls. On either side of the hall were steep stairs leading to the two rooms above. I used to worry if the structure ever caught on fire how the upper grade pupils rushing pell-mell down these stairs, might pile up at the bottom.

Earlier, when just the two lower rooms were adequate for the Sandy children, I had the first four grades and Nina Malar had the four upper grades. The upper rooms housed the start of the Sandy high. There was one teacher, a callow youth who, sad to say, was more interested in romance than education.

One afternoon after Nina and I had taken up school, we were amazed at the clamor and confusion overhead. We couldn't understand what was happening. Later the story came out, that the romantic pedagogue had taken an attractive pupil in one of the rooms and proposed to her while the rest of the dozen or so scholars taking turns, were peeking through the keyhole trying to discover what was going on. Sad to say, the proposal was rejected by the bewildered damsel. Poor man. Do hope he found romance later, as one year terminated his stay in Sandy.

Lydia took me on a tour of her daughter Betty and son-in-law Rod Johnson's radio station, KWJJ, which is located in the old Pitcock mansion. The Johnsons purchased this famous landmark some years ago and with infinite care and patience here restored it to its former splendor.

The house with landscaped grounds is imposing on the outside and equally so in the interior. Many of the costly furnishings came around the "Horn" in the days of the sailing ships. What marble fireplaces in every room; what intricately carved wood work; what gold patterned wall paper; the beautiful inlaid

floors! The two staircases rising to the second floor with their carved banisters are impressive and one can easily visualize beautifully gowned ladies descending the stairs to the party rooms below. A bathtub that weighs five hundred pounds is now relegated to the old barn.

There is what was called a passed pantry as food was passed from the kitchen through it to the dining room. No doubt a series of stately butlers trod its floor. All in all this home presents a picture of a bygone era and it is a fine thing that it has been restored.

We, also, visited OMSI which featured a science exhibit of Portland school children. Their projects are simply amazing. One can't help but feel optimistic over the future generation. Even little first graders presented intricate, well carried out experiments.

There were numerous exhibits showing the harmful effects of cigarette smoking. Cigarettes used to be dubbed "coffin nails" and time has demonstrated the truth of the adage. Anyone who has never indulged should be very thankful. A healthy lung was displayed along with one of a diseased lung which had been harmed by smoking. It resembled a charred piece of meat.

A poem we used to say comes to mind: "Tobacco is an evil weed—'Twas the devil sowed the seed Makes a chimney of your nose."

Local United Good Neighbors To Get Assistance This Year

Sandy United Good Neighbors residential volunteers will have help available this year from a former South Alpine residential director who knows their problems from experience.

She is Mrs. Donald Frommiller who served as 1963-64 UGN South Alpine Residential chairman and has been appointed 1966 UGN East Metropolitan Division Residential Advisor. Glenn Eaton, UGN East Met-

ropolitan Division chairman, explained Mrs. Frommiller's responsibilities: "She will act as a resource person for the Sandy residential chairman, and others through out the East Metropolitan Division. Part of her job is helping train, advise, and inspire the district residential chairmen. She will also accompany district chairmen, on request, when they are recruiting residential chairmen. Finally, she will act as chairman of division meetings of district residential chairmen."

Eaton said he is confident that the volunteers from the Sandy area will put together a winning campaign team. He stressed, however, the importance of early recruitment, and said he is seeking volunteers at this time.

Mrs. Frommiller said: "I'm very happy to be serving in this capacity. I've often felt it would be very helpful to have someone, in addition to the UGN professional staff, to call on for advice. I think too many people overlook the public relations aspect of the campaign that is served simply by calling on people. In the residential areas, this is one of the important functions we can perform."

United Good Neighbors conducts one annual campaign for support of 92 health, welfare, character-building, and rehabilitation services in Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington counties.
