HILDEGARD G. BAUMANN

Mrs. Hildegard Gertrude Baumann, 62, of 506 E. Scenic Dr., Sandy, died at a local hospital May 20 after an illness of about six months.

Mrs. Baumann was born Hildegard Gertrude Neubert, Nov. 26, 1903 in the area of Saxony, East Germany.

The early years of her life were spent in Germany. In 1923, she left the land of her birth and moved to the United States. She settled in Illinois, where on Dec. 22, 1923 at Staunton, she married Paul Martin Baumann. In 1924 they moved to Iowa, in 1927 to Minnesota. Twelve years later, in 1939, they settled in Wisconsin and in 1949 they moved to Oregon, making their home in Portland, until 1953, at which time they moved to Sandy.

She was a member of the Immanuel Lutheran church of Sandy, a charter member of the Valparaiso Guild of Euclyps, Wis., a member of the Lutheran Education Society of Portland. Their daughter, Gertrude Elizabeth died at the age of 17.

She is survived by the widow, P. Martin of Sandy. She was the last of her own family. Funeral services were held Tuesday, May 24, in the Chapel of the Immanuel Lutheran church, Sandy. Vault interment was in Riverview cemetery. Rev. Walter A. Luedtke officiated and the services and William Elliott sang.

What's Cooking?

Raspberry Toffee Angel Food - simple, easy, delicious.

Use any 9 in. angel food cake. Defrost and drain well 2 pkgs. frozen raspberries. Save out enough berries to decorate top with a ring of berries. Coarsely chop 8 Heath bars (5¢ size) of English Toffee. Stir into berries. Refrigerate. Shortly before serving whip 1 pt. cream and fold into raspberry mixture. Cut cake into 3 layers. Spread raspberry cream mixture between layers and over top and sides. Note: Frozen strawberries may replace raspberries. For an extra special treat, use two 9 meringues instead of cake.
