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New Manager At Phone Co.

Effective June 1, Raymond Sheehan has been appointed southern division manager for West Coast Telephone company, operating vice president W. E. Carroll announced today. Lyle E. Cross, previous division manager, will be on special assignment.

Sheehan comes to West Coast Telephone company of California, where he started as a clerk in 1936, progressing to the position of manager of the San Joaquin division in 1953. In 1957, he was named vice president and division manager of General Telephone company of the Southeast (in N.C.), where he served until 1960, when he returned to California as an assistant vice president-service. In 1961 he was appointed Oxnard division manager, the position he leaves to join West Coast Telephone company.

In his new assignment as southern division manager, Sheehan will be responsible for all West Coast Telephone operations in Oregon and northern California, as well as for Beaver State Telephone, which serves the Lakeview area. He will make his headquarters in Beaverton.

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
