Pre-Season Football Dates Set

Tickets are now available by mail for the two National League pre-season games scheduled at Multnomah Stadium. It has been announced by ticket manager, George Rickles, of Oregon Sports Attractions.

First of the two games matches the Minnesota Vikings and Pittsburgh Steelers on Saturday night, August 13, with the Steelers slated for a return engagement against the San Francisco 49ers a week later on August 20.

Minnesota Coach Norm Van Brocklin has already announced that Bob Berry, former Oregon All-American quarterback, will draw the starting assignment for the Vikings.

Local flavor for the 49ers will be provided by linebacker Dave Wilcox and End Vern Burke. Dave Tobey, off last year's Oregon team, will be in action for the Steelers under their new head coach, former Oregon Stater Bill Austin.

Reserved seats for both games are priced at \$5 and seating preference will be given to applications for both games. Tickets may be obtained by writing OSA headquarters at 510 S.W. Yamhill, Box offices for the sale of tickets will not open until August 1.
