

Sandy Bowlers Get Slice of WIBC Bacon

The WIBC has announced final results of the WIBC tournament held in New Orleans during April and May.

The City of Sandy team placed 388 among 2,456 teams entered in Division 2. The team score of 2165 for the three game series netted the team prize money of \$30. 819 positions were paid, low to cash was 2081.

Jo Lewis and Carolyn Duff, teaming in the doubles, netted \$30 for their 227 place with a 954 series. Division 2 doubles with 4,159 entries paid 1,388 places, with low to cash being 877.

In Division 2 singles with 7,423 entries, Kay Metzger's 490 was good for 530th place and \$10. Carolyn Duff's 461 gave her \$6 for 1,160th place. 2,375 positions were paid, low to cash was 444.
