Mt. Hood, Portland Colleges Negotiate

Mt. Hood Community College plans to negotiate a two-way reciprocal agreement with Portland Community College this fall.

In other words, students from one district will be able to attend classes in the other.

At present, about 300 Mt. Hood-district students are attending classes in Portland with Mt. Hood paying tuition.

There are strong indications, however, that a number of Portland students, particularly from Madison and Marshall high schools, may come this way to attend classes in the fall. Thus, the necessity for a reciprocal agreement.

Dr. Earl Klapstein, college president, has been directed to negotiate the agreement with Portland.
