

Temporary Campus Opens on County Fairgrounds

The temporary campus of Mt. Hood Community College will be located on the Multnomah County Fairgrounds when the college begins classes on September 19.

Shortly after the annual county fair closes this year, personnel will begin preparing the buildings for occupation by the college.

The map adjacent to this article indicates where some of the college facilities will be located when classes start.

Facilities for the college library and for certain subject areas will be located very close to the campus, but not on the

rods," Heuchert stated. "The program is specifically designed to teach the principles of automotive repair as they pertain to standard model automobiles."

Heuchert pointed out that "the training facility will be a modern, well-equipped shop which has most of the current electronic testing equipment used in commercial shops."

"Among other offerings we hope to have are electronics, licensed practical nursing, and horticulture," Heuchert said.

The electronics program is a two-year program for electronic technicians. Courses would be designed to train a student in the repair of radio, TV, and basic electronic equipment.

The courses would be directed toward the servicing of electronic equipment rather than the designing of electronic circuitry.

The licensed practical nursing program is tentatively planned to start during the coming academic year. Currently, the lay advisory committee, which advises the college on curriculum development, is preparing a program proposal which will be submitted to the State Board of Nursing Education for their evaluation.

The horticulture program is a two-year program which includes instruction in soils, fertilizers, agricultural marketing, plant management, and landscaping.

The job of each committee includes advising the college staff on such matters as program needs, curriculum content, and the type and amount of equipment needed for specific programs. Later, the committee members will also evaluate Mt. Hood Community College graduates, and suggest revisions to update curriculum.

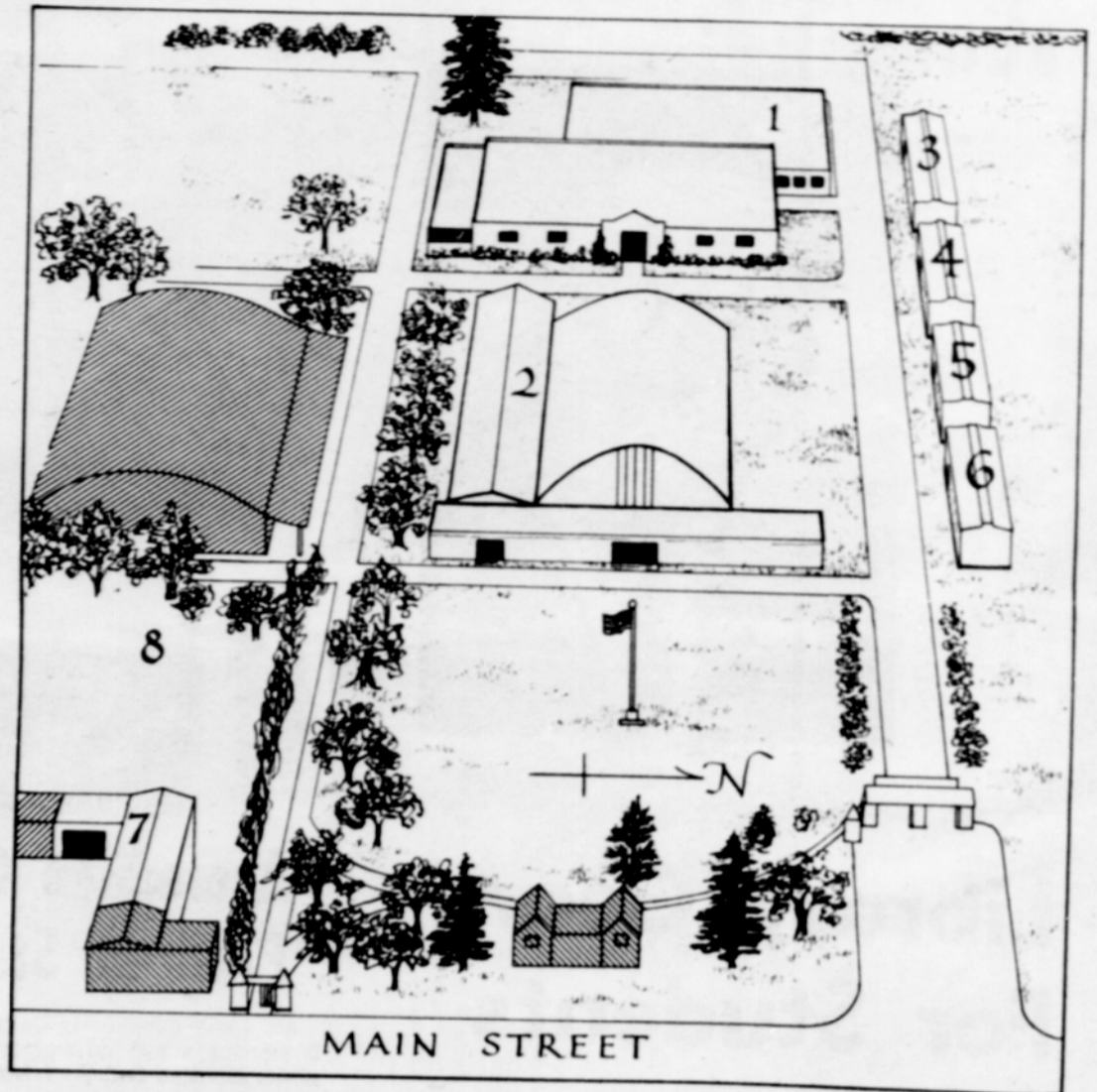
