Eddie Townsend Dies at Age 74

Funeral services for Eddie Pecos Townsend, Gresham dairy farm operator and Chamber of Commerce member, were held Monday, Aug. 1, at Bateman Funeral chapel with Rev. Clayton Shepherd of the First Baptist church in Lincoln City officiating. Interment was in Douglass cemetery.

Townsend served several years as a 4-H club leader, was active in the Gresham Grange and greatly assisted in the establishment of the Portland Dairy Co-operative Association and the Farmers Pacific Supply Co-operative.

As a dairy farmer, he took pride in the breeding and milk production records of cows in his herd. Each year he had a number of cattle in the showing at the Multnomah County Fair, the Oregon State Fair and the Pacific International Exposition, winning many ribbons.

For several years, Townsend was superintendent of the livestock division of the county fair and was a former Scoutmaster of Troop 273 sponsored by the Cedar School PTA. He also served as manager of Forest Lawn cemetery in Gresham and later worked on the custodial staff in Gresham public schools. After he retired he moved to his cabin on the coast at Lincoln City. He died there July 26 at the age of 74.

He was a native of Gollad, Texas and in 1913 he married Louise Green in Colbert, Wash. He is survived by five children, Robert E. of Gresham, Harold L. of Sandy, Homer J. of Spokane, Vernon T. of Ephrata, Wash., and Mrs. Bonnie L. Clawson of Gresham; 13 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren, and a sister, Mrs. Eliza Hoelling of Oceano, Calif.

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
