Reynolds iced it early in the final period as Woodward took a handoff and barreled 31 yards for the Lancers' final touchdown making it 21-6. After Woodward added his third straight extra point.

JESUIT over PARKROSE... THE DALLES over REYNOLDS... Another one that could easily be wrong. The Dalles is given my choice just on the strength of the two week's ago victory over Jesuit. SILVERTON over CANBY... Silverton should make it two perfect seasons in a row at Canby -- 0-9 both years. Canby, beaten 66-0 by powerful Jesuit last week, shouldn't lose that bad this time to not a really strong Silverton team that's for sure! This concludes the Wilco League's final week, and the toughest one for picks all year.

Many prizes to be given away at the party are on display in the window of the Sandy Post. Tickets may be purchased at the door or from any member of the bowling club.

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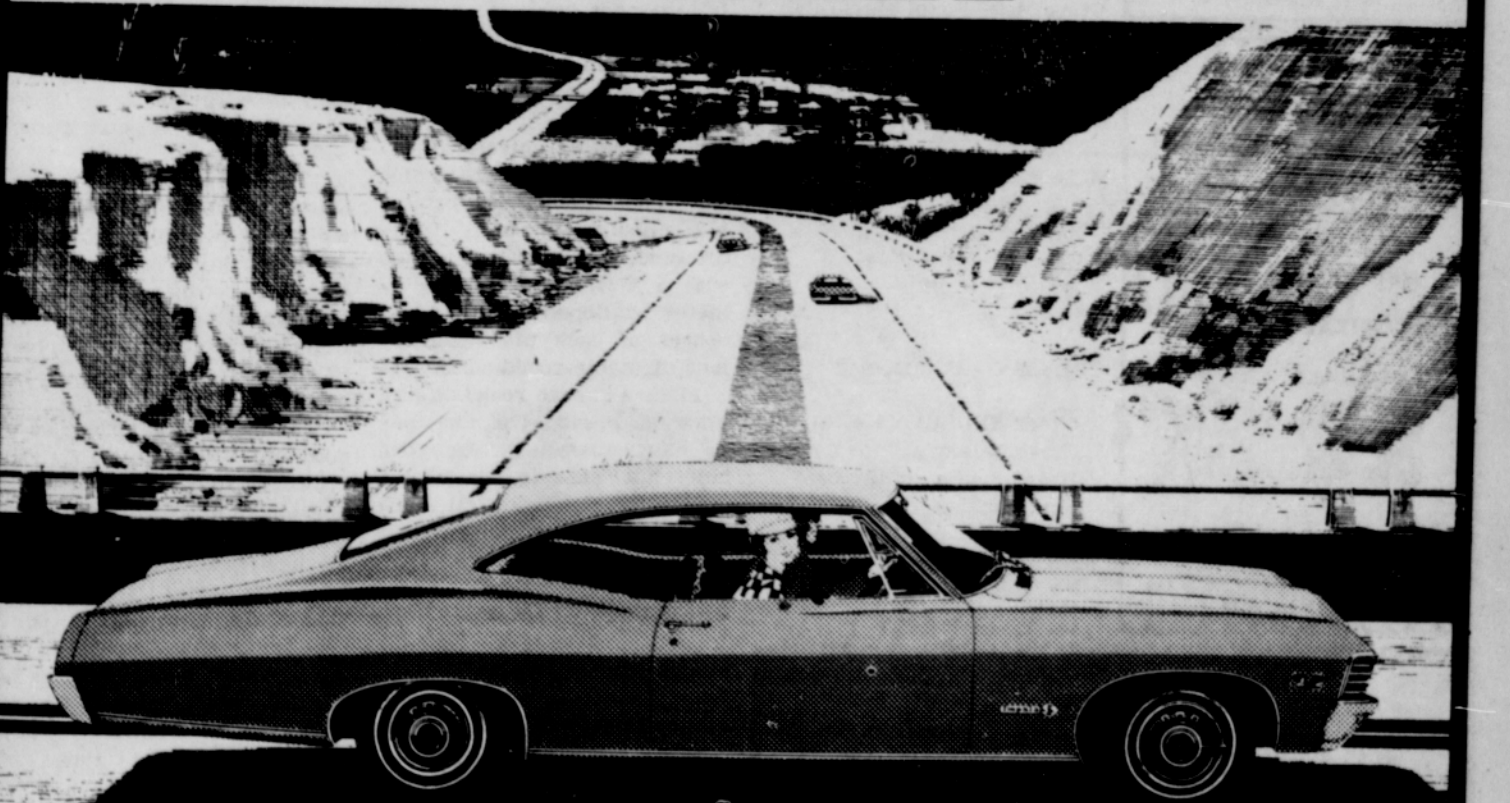
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
