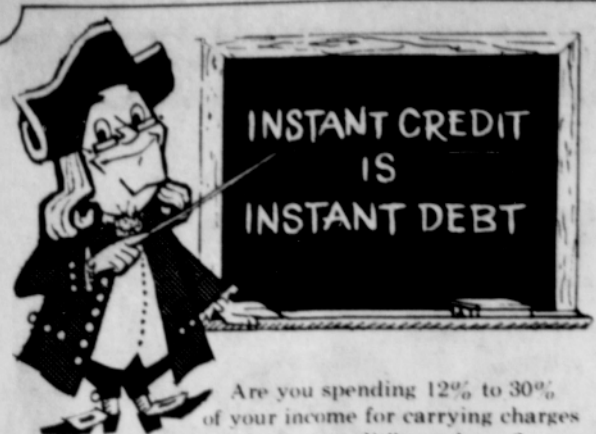




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"Making the Sandy Scene"

PVT. ROBERT CARLSON

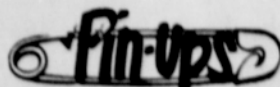
Pvt. Robert W. Carlson has reported to Ft. Eustis, Va., for a twelve-week course studying helicopter repair.

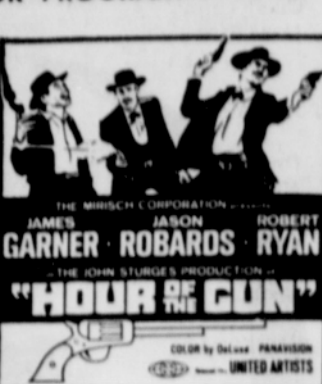

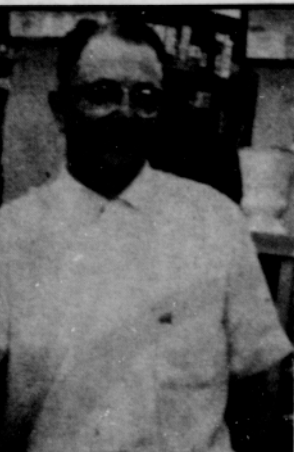
