CLASSES START MONDAY, MARCH 25

Classes start the week of March 25 - 28 and run for ten consecutive meetings, once a week for three hours per meeting, with the exception of Scuba Diving.

Registration:

Students may pre-register starting March 18 on campus from 1:30 to 3:30 P.M. or from 7:00 to 9:00 P.M., at the Student Services Mobile Unit located on the South Campus near the parking lot.

Registration will also be conducted on campus and at Gresham High School classes on first class night.

In most cases, registrations will be closed after the first class session for each class. There will be no mail-in registration this quarter.

BASIC SEAMANSHIP
