At the February Fireside meeting of the Sandy Business and Professional Women's Club at the home of Mrs. Alfred Gunderson, President Audrey Colson and North Willamette District Publicity Chairman Florence Schmitz called attention to the following important dates: April 3, dinner and program honoring past presidents will be held at the Chuck Wagon Restaurant; May 24-26, State Convention for the Oregon Federation at the Eugene Hotel. The theme for the Convention's Friday night Fun Night honoring State President Gladys Myers was announced as "Gladys and Her Beanstalk." What's Cooking?

MILE-HIGH LIMEADE PIE
1 env. (1 Tbsp) unflavored gelatin
1/2 cup cold water
4 beaten egg yolks
1 6-oz. can frozen limeade concentrate
4 egg whites
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup heavy cream, whipped
1 9-in. graham cracker crust or 1 baked pastry shell, cooled
In top of double boiler, soften gelatin in cold water; add beaten yolks and dash of salt. Cook and stir over hot, not boiling water until mixture is slightly thick. Remove from heat. Stir in concentrate. Chill, stirring occasionally, until mixture mounds slightly when spooned. Beat egg whites until soft peaks form.
Gradually add sugar, beating to stiff peaks. Fold in gelatin mixture, then whipped cream. Add few drops green food coloring. Pile into pie shell. Chill until firm. Serves 6-8. --From the files of Sara S. Berger, Sandy, Oregon.
Note: One could also use lemonade concentrate and a few drops of yellow food coloring and Mile-High Lemon Chiffon Pie.

STEWED TOMATOES
4 slices toasted white bread
6 tablespoons (3/4 stick) butter
1/4 cup chopped onion
1 can (1 lb, 12 oz.) tomatoes
1 tablespoon sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper
2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
Cut three slices bread into 1/2-inch cubes (about 2 cups); cut remaining slices into strips for top. Place bread cubes in 1 1/4-quart casserole. In a medium skillet melt butter; saute onion until tender. Add tomatoes, sugar, salt and pepper; turn into casserole. Arrange bread strips on top; sprinkle Parmesan cheese over all. Bake in a preheated 350 degree oven 45 minutes.

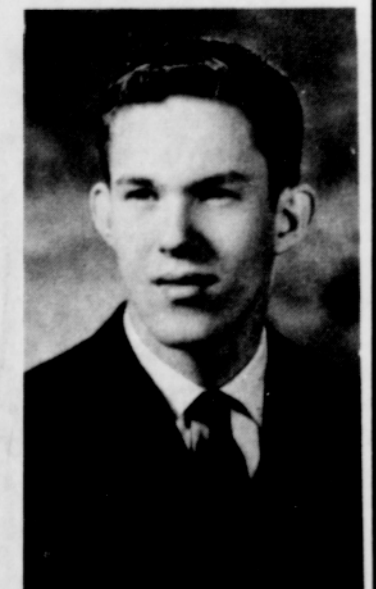
Saints In 5-Way Gresham Meet
