Earnings Increase

Burgess told stockholders at the company's annual meeting here that first quarter sales were \$26,795,512, an increase over the \$26,484,658 recorded for the similar period in 1967.

Burgess said that results for 1968 are expected to exceed 1967's sales of \$112,438,000

and profits of \$2,630,000, or \$1.42 per share.

The company bases its optimism, Burgess indicated, on a number of important developments in ES' three groups -- materials technology, electronics and space conditioning. "During 1967 ES closed the loop as a fully integrated "super vendor."
