Vandalism Hits Recreation Areas

A rash of vandalism has broken out in the Forest Service recreation areas near Multnomah Falls. The past month the element of our population causing this destruction has been out in force, states a report by Donald H. Smith, District Ranger, Columbia Gorge District.

Smith said that a large information sign was stolen at Horsetail Falls along the Columbia River Scenic Highway the evening of April 15. An alert Sheriff's Deputy recovered this sign in the vicinity of S.E. 181 and Powell and apprehended two young men both over 18 years old. The sign was sticking out of the trunk of their car. The Multnomah County District Attorney prosecuted this case and the individuals pleaded guilty to tearing down this sign. They have been sentenced to a year's probation with the addition of re-installing the sign at Horsetail Falls.

A three by five foot trail sign was stolen from the junction of Oneonta Creek Trail and the Columbia River Scenic Highway in early May. It was removed from the supporting posts. The sign has not been recovered nor the guilty party found.

The evening of May 14, the women's restroom at Multnomah Falls Lodge was vandalized. A large mirror was torn from the wall and stolen. A storage closet was broken open and toilet tissue removed. This tissue was then scattered east from the Lodge along the Scenic Highway. The F.B.I. and Multnomah County Sheriff's Office are investigating this destruction of Government Property.
