Clackamas County Extension Offers 'At Home' Food Course

Clackamas County is launching a new venture, a correspondence course in food buying called "You--The Food Shopper." The free course will provide "at home" lessons for homemakers who find it difficult to attend meetings because they have small children, or for other reasons.

The lessons will help food buyers get more for their money, and help them plan nutritionally balanced meals. Topics covered in the course include

planning ahead for food shopping, what the good buys are, how to make sure foods are wholesome and safe, buying tips for meats, fresh produce and other foods, and information on convenience foods.

The five-lesson course will begin July 15, 1968. All interested homemakers are urged to call the County Extension Office, phone 656-2641, Ext. 357, to learn more about the lessons or to register for the course.

Corbett to Vote Trimmed Budget

A new proposed budget levy of \$107,408.35 will be offered Corbett school district residents in an election Friday, June 28, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. at Corbett grade school. About \$40,000 was trimmed from the proposed budget after it was defeated by a two to one margin in an election June 3.

Elimination of items (baseball, some maintenance and field trips among others), reorganization of the school lunch program and year-end balancing of revenues contributed to the budget cut.

Oregon State Game Commission News

The State of Oregon Game Commission planted several hundred catchable rainbow trout in Olallie lake this last week. Reports from Olallie indicate that fishing has been good. The fish caught ranged from eight to fourteen inches long. Anglers were also having success on the Clackamas River between the Lowe Creek Bridge and the Oak Grove Fork of the Clackamas River.

Trail work has been completed on the Monon lake trail.

Visitors are advised to wear rubber boots on the section of trail around the Monon lake outlet. About eight inches of water covers this section of trail.

A reminder to forest visitors. The fire season is upon us, and we need your cooperation in order to prevent forest fires. The following rules will aid in attaining this goal:

1. Hold matches until cold--then break in two.
2. Crush all smokes dead in an ash tray.

3. Be sure all fires are out and cold before leaving camp.
4. Carry a bucket, shovel, and an axe when camping outside designated campgrounds.
5. Report all uncontained fires to the nearest Guard Station or District Ranger office.

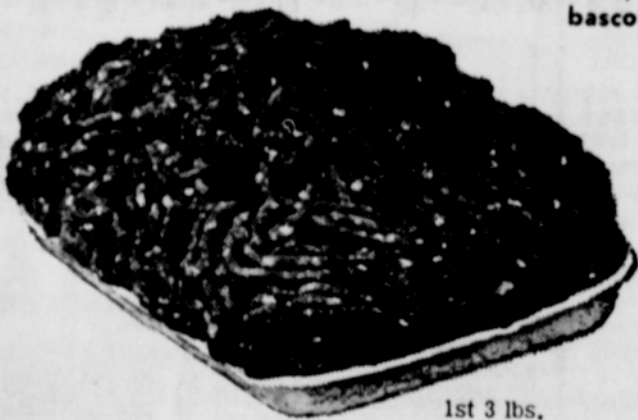
