COLUMN COMMENTS

Sign's that spring will soon be here are beginning to appear. Springtime is a lovely period of the year. Freshly plowed fields, farmers optimistically sowing seeds, new plans being made, hopes and dreams spring forth in our minds like daffodils from the soil.

In Oregon before spring comes this year we apparently will go through a different season, but one not new to Oregon, let's call it the "Tax Season." It currently seems to be you are hunting - change in method of taxation, lower taxes, shifting of tax burden, changing formula for school support.

Lower taxes seems to be a popular critter to hunt but hard to catch. If you find a way let me know. I can probably use the same method to lower the price of items in the store. Those shoes I used to buy for \$8.95 which were suddenly worth \$11.95 and the last pair I bought on sale for \$15.95. Inflation has increased prices of all items we pay money for including taxes. Hopefully salaries and incomes will continue to increase which will enable us to survive inflation and have some extra left to make life more pleasant and enjoyable.

Inflation, schools, welfare, and population growth have all contributed to higher taxes but little has been said about another contributor, the automobile. It was a surprise to find out that State and Local government spending for transportation, mainly highways, has been exceeded only by education since World War II; and accounts for nearly one-fifth of all state and local spending.

Growing numbers and greater use of motor vehicles, increased construction and maintenance costs of highways, are reasons why transportation outlays are so great. The number of registered motor vehicles increased by 69% from 1950-1966 in Oregon and the miles traveled per vehicle have also increased. The states 1.2 million vehicles also create costs for landscaping, drainage, lighting, traffic control, parking facilities, police and court operation, safety programs, hospital operations and so forth. The automobile has contributed to higher taxes and this should be recognized.

The "Tax Season" is just beginning but already the kettle is starting to boil.
