

Ihrke, Schneider Combo Overpowers Cougars

SANDY, 79; CANBY, 54
Bob Ihrke and Don Schneider closed out their high school basketball careers Friday night in rousing fashion. The pair combined for 48 points, Ihrke getting 25 and Sneed 23, to lead Sandy to a 79-54 slaughter of Canby.

Between them the two Seniors blistered the Cords for 19 field goals, and together they shot .633 per cent from the floor. A spectacular first-half explosion; during which they scored 40 points to only 23 by the enemy, carried coach Nick Robertson's Frontiersmen to their convincing triumph and completely wiped out any Cougar hopes for victory.

Performing before the smallest audience of the year, the rival quintets matched points early, then the Pioneers took command, 24-14 after the first quarter, and 40-23 at halftime.

By the time the third quarter had ended Sandy had a 25-point lead at 58-33, largely on the scoring of Ihrke and Schneider.

After this the game was finished out, mostly by reserves of both sides, as both coaches gave their second-liners some playing time. Schneider, who finished the year with a 15.8 average, 315 points in 20 league games and 15.9 in all games, was in double figures for the 22nd straight game this year.

Roger Williams, the 6-1 junior guard, hit the twin digit 20 out of 22 games this year. Rog scored 239 points in league play, an 11.9 average. Overall his average was 12.4;

Indian Rally Downs Pioneers

The Dalles scored ten straight points midway in the second half to break open a close game and score a 67-51 win over Sandy at The Dalles Tuesday.

The Pioneers had three men in double figures, Roger Williams, 15; Don Schneider, 14; and Jim Sliger, 12; but they were overshadowed by the second half Indian rally. Sandy only trailed by a slim 26-21 at halftime, but Paul Poetsch's Tribe spurred for ten straight points to put the Indians ahead to stay in the second half.

6-4 Sophomore DHS center Vic Todd sparked the rally, scoring six of the 10 points and 26 in the game. Bob Drake, a 6-2 Senior forward, dropped in

the other four in that spurt and wound up with 22 for the evening. Sandy is now 6-3 in second half league play 14-7 overall, after this loss.

The Dalles opened in a man-to-man defense while the Pioneers came up with a 2-3 zone. The zone defense frustrated the Indian shooters, who shot only 34 per cent in the first half.

In the second half, however, the Indians improved and their speed was evident in the numerous ball steals by Bob Bellamy and Ed Sandoz.

Both teams were cool at the start of the second half and with 12 minutes remaining the Pioneers were still very much in the ball game, trailing by only a 31-27 margin. Indian center Todd then hit a lay-in to start the Tribe's spurt of ten straight points.

For the Indians it was the second straight win over the Pioneers, a feat which they had accomplished only once before.

Blue Marlin Swimmer Sets New State Record

Joanne Cyphers, Sandy 10-year-old, who has a seal-like affinity for swimming, was the most outstanding performer in the two-day Red Conference swimming championships held at the Sandy pool Saturday and Sunday.

Competing in her ten and under girls age group, she captured the 50-yard freestyle, the 50-yard breaststroke and the 100-yard individual medley. In doing so, Joanne set a new state record for the medley—the only record broken in the 68 events of the meet.

Another triple winner for the local Blue Marlin Aquatic Club was Ron Kipp who swam in the boys 14 and under age group. Ron won the 200 yard freestyle, the 200 yard individual medley and the 100 yard breaststroke.

Lori Anderson, girls 11 and 12, won the 100 yard freestyle, while the team of Ron Hewitt, Steve Roth, Carl Neuenfeldt and Dubble Hayes took first place in the boys 11 and 12, relay event.

The Saints' Jackie Smith made the all-tourney team and missed the tourney's most-valuable-player award by only one vote. Dave Smith earned all-tourney honorable mention.

Mt. Hood finished the season with a 20-9 mark and now is 43-11 for the two years the school has been in existence.

The Saints lose heavily by graduation—both Smiths, Phil Walden, Jerry Vandehey, Bob Guffey, Orvil Tetz—but have a good nucleus returning in Mel Farris and Vede Simington.
