Mrs. Evelyn Clement packed books, Mrs. Caroline Frasier unpacked and placed books in the new library, and Timmy Frasier was a big help, too.

Ed Perren, Gordon Barnum, Charles Frasier, Jr., Gary Connelly and Tom Boothby carried boxes of books by the hundreds. Arleigh Hall helped with the numbering system, as the books had to be kept in the same order in which they came off the shelves.
