Gordon Hudson, chairman of the Oregon liquor control commission, issued a reminder today that there may be no sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption during the hours the polls are open for the primary election Tuesday. This applies only to those days when state-wide elections are held; no closure is required in the case of local elections. Grocery stores may sell beer and wine for off-premises consumption.

Hudson also announced that all state liquor stores and agencies will be closed on Election Day and on Memorial Day, Saturday, May 30.
