Federal funds help

Forty per cent of the total federal funds available in 1969-1970 for community college construction in Oregon have been awarded to Mt. Hood Community College.

A grant for \$204,857 has been given to MHCC for use towards building the college's Main Academic Center, according to MHCC President Dr. Earl Klapstein. These funds were made available under the Higher Education Facilities Act (HEFA).

A total of \$1,254,403 of HEFA funds have been awarded to date to help build Mt. Hood Community College.

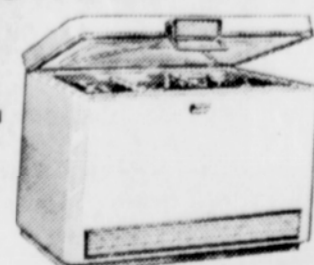
