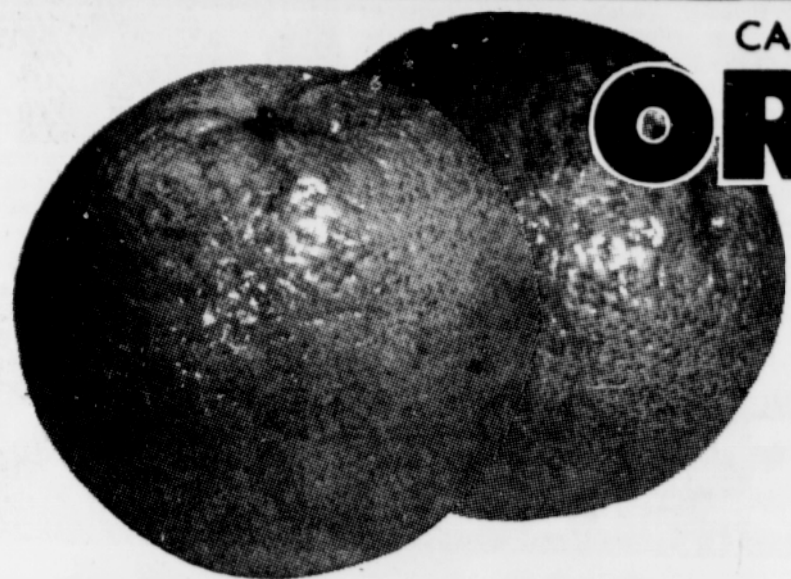

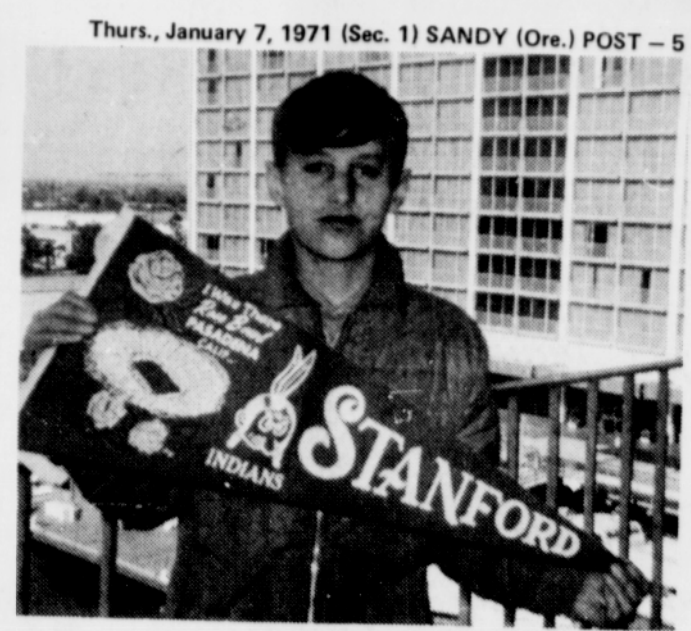

Drug meet is planned

Plans for the Third National Institute on Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs have been announced by Clackamas County District Attorney Roger Rook.

Rook, who is Oregon Director of the National District Attorneys Association, said this week that he has sent invitations to educators throughout Oregon to attend the two drug conferences planned by the NDAA in Chicago, February 14 to 18, and in Las Vegas, April 25 to 29.

Rook said that the conferences are designed specifically to facilitate the exchange of information between law enforcement personnel and educators regarding drug abuse.

"Oregon educators who have attended these conferences in 1969 and 1970 have come back to us with unreserved endorsements of the program," Rook said. He added that he expects shortly to receive a full program for the conferences from William B. Randall, President of the NDAA and District Attorney in St. Paul, Minnesota.

Dimes march to begin in county

A kick-off rally for the Mothers March for the March of Dimes is being held at 10 a.m. today in the Lloyd Center auditorium. Invitations were sent to more than 300 volunteer leaders in the tri-county area.

An estimated 10,000 volunteers are expected to take part in the tri-county Mothers March on Jan. 28. They will go door-to-door throughout Washington, Clackamas and Multnomah counties, seeking funds to fight birth defects.

The rally, which will include a fashion show, will be hosted by chairmen from various parts of the tri-county. They are Mrs. Thomas J. Mahoney, Portland, Multnomah county; Mrs. D.J. Sirianni of Milwaukie, Clackamas county; Mrs. Gene Jackson of Tigard, Washington county, and Mrs. Lawrence Smith of Gresham, east Multnomah county.

In addition to the fashion show the leaders will receive instructions on the march and hear talks by Doug LaMear of Portland, tri-county March of Dimes general chairman, and Dr. Neil Buist, director of the metabolic birth defects center at the University of Oregon medical school. The center is supported by March of Dimes funds.
