Mothers March is set for next week

The month-long March of Dimes campaign moved ahead on several fronts during the past week and the tempo will continue to increase through the climactic event—the Mothers March—on Jan. 28, according to Doug LaMear, general chairman for the tri-county educational and fund-raising effort. Public, private and parochial schools in Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington counties opened their week-long campaign on Monday, Jan. 18. Mrs. Ray Haroldson is the Washington county schools chairman and her counterparts in Clackamas and Multnomah counties are William Gregory and Mrs. Bennetta B. Orton, respectively. More than 10,000 volunteers in the 3 counties are expected to take part in the Mothers March. In addition to seeking funds for the fight against birth defects, the marchers will distribute educational literature on birth defects and conduct a census on families that have had Rubella (German measles) vaccine. Results of the Rubella vaccine will be given to health authorities in the 3 counties. The census will be on an area rather than an individual basis. Sandy area receives food

Figures show that the Sandy-Hoodland area received eight per cent of the food distributed by the county Abundant Food Center located in Gladstone during 1970.

The Clackamas County program reported this week that 3,925,565 lbs. of surplus food was delivered to 105,673 persons in the county during the year.

The largest month was December with 10,118 persons being served.

The Sandy, Estacada and Molalla areas received about 32 per cent of the surplus food in the county, according to this year's report.
