**BOUNDARY CHANGE PROPOSALS TO BE CONSIDERED: (Proposal No. 244)**  
 Annexation of the following property to the City of Sandy:

All of tracts 2 (two) and 6 (six) HOOD VIEW CRES. in Section 2, Township 2 South, Range 4 East of the Willamette Meridian, Clackamas County, Oregon as described in the duly recorded map and plat thereof in the office of the County Clerk of Clackamas County, Oregon.

(Proposal No. 245)  
 Formation of the following territory into the Clackamas County Sanitary Service District No. 10 (Rhododendron Green):

Lots 21 and 22, Block 3 of FRANZETTI ADDITION TO RHODOENDRON and

Blocks 5, 6, and 8, FRANZETTI ADDITION TO RHODOENDRON, Clackamas County, Oregon, RECEIVING THEREFROM the following described tracts:

PARCEL A: The South 4 feet of said Block 8 conveyed to Clackamas County for sidewalk purposes by deed recorded March 16, 1925, in Book 179, page 41, Deed Records.

PARCEL B: Part of said Block 6, conveyed to George H. Fraser, et ux, by deed recorded October 12, 1962, in Book 611, page 187, Deed Records, Fee No. 22354, described as follows:

**Sensible dieting hints told**

Has your holiday happiness been replaced with chagrin over added pounds—so easy to put on, so hard to take off?

Weight reduction can be successful and the results very satisfying if a sensible approach is taken. First of all, don't expect instant results, say extension home economists.

Make a long term plan - one that you can live with. By cutting 250 calories from food eaten each day, you can expect to lose about half a pound of fatty tissue per week.

Remember though, that the scales may tell you a different story due to variations in retention and loss of water.

What diet plan should you use? Newspapers, magazines, and books offer hundreds to choose from.

Evaluating a diet from a magazine or planning your own personalized diet is a relatively simple matter if you keep one basic principle in mind.

Remember that while cutting calories, you still need adequate proteins, vitamins and minerals. They keep the body running smoothly, keep you feeling good. The key to wise calorie reduction lies in the basic four food groups. Simply select the lower calorie foods from each group.

From the milk group, two cups of skim milk are a wise low calorie choice. From the meat group, eat lean meat, fish or poultry. Two 3-ounce servings (cooked weight) are all you need. Go heavy on fruits and vegetables, packed full of nutrients but few calories. Have four servings at least.

And don't leave out those vitamins and iron. Go light on the jams, sugar and fats that add the calories to these foods.

In summary, when you decide on a reducing diet plan, check it first for nutritional quality. Look for the "basic 4" food groups. Don't skip meals. Base your diet on foods you like and can afford. This is one of enriched breads, and cereals, so important for proteins, the advantages of designing your own personal plan. You'll be more likely to stick to it—and those pounds will start to disappear.

One reminder: If you plan to lose more than a few pounds, be sure to seek your doctor's advice on reducing.

**Home hit for \$7,000 loss**

## County Kidney Fund seeks more money Adventists slate Bible meetings

The Kidney Association of Oregon has raised more than \$38,000 during the first two months of its statewide fund drive which started early in November, leaving \$112,000 to be obtained for the program to save the lives of Oregonians suffering from kidney failure.

"The response from individuals, businesses and organizations to our plea for help has been excellent," stated Chuck Foster, Executive Director for KOA, "and if the level of support continues, we will meet our goal of \$150,000."

Foster urged the public to send tax deductible contributions to their local Post Office. The Post Office box for Clackamas County is number 14, Oregon City, Oregon 97045.

To care for the 20 patients now in the program receiving treatment on artificial kidney machines and to add at least 12 new patients in 1971 who develop kidney failure, KOA has budgeted the \$150,000.

KOA faces an expense of about \$10,000 for each new patient for the first six months in the program. This money is needed to pay for an artificial kidney machine, 10 weeks of training and treatment at Good Samaritan Hospital in Portland and take-home medical supplies. After the first year, the cost drops to approximately \$4,000 a year for followup medical treatment and supplies for the patient using the machine in his home.

Since most kidney failure victims cannot afford the extremely high costs involved, the function of the Kidney Association of Oregon is to raise the money necessary for its patients so they can work, raise families and be useful people.
