The Rev. Sam L. Sasser, an Assemblies of God missionary to Micronesia, will be guest speaker Sunday April 4th, 9:45 and 11:00 a.m. at the Sandy Assembly of God Church, the Rev. Jim Davis, pastor, has announced.

Sasser and his wife Florence were active in Bible school work, literature distribution, evangelism, establishing churches, and radio ministry during their past term of missionary service. With headquarters in the Marshall Islands, Sasser served as field fellowship chairman and as superintendent of the western district of the Micronesian Assemblies of God. Packwood seeking funds

Senator Bob Packwood urged a Senate subcommittee Tuesday to give special consideration to the fishing rights of Indians under existing treaties.

Packwood proposed an assistance program costing \$250,000 annually and to be administered from the Bureau of Interior's Portland office. An estimated 80 per cent of the efforts of seven professional fishery biologists, three non professionals and several seasonal aides would be directed at providing assistance to Indians.

Packwood said the management of anadromous fishes, such as steelhead and salmon species, is most difficult and highly technical. He said sport and commercial fishermen, as well as the Indians, are concerned about these fish returning to their spawning grounds that often are located in Indian reservations.

Packwood also urged that a \$38,000 appropriation be made to establish fishery management assistance at Madras, Oregon. This would allow the hiring of two permanent personnel and provide for their travel to such areas as Warm Springs and Umatilla Indian Reservations, Crater Lake National Park and several National Wildlife Refuges.

He also requested a speed up on construction of the \$3.2 million Warm Springs National Fish Hatchery in Wasco County. Only \$425,000 has been appropriated to the hatchery since it was authorized in May 1966.

Packwood also made these key recommendations made to the Senate Sub-Committee on Appropriations of the Interior Department:

—Construct a new office complex in Roseburg at a cost of \$800,000 to house the Bureau of Land Management. Packwood said the building would save taxpayers \$668,000 over the next 30 years because of the savings which would be realized. The building would be constructed on five acres of land at the Veteran's Hospital grounds. BLM is now housed in a leased warehouse which is too spread out to be efficient, he explained.

—Allocate required funds so that a mineral education program can be established by Oregon State University at the Albany Metallurgy Research Center in Albany.

—Provide \$27,400 for additional staff personnel at Crater Lake National Park in Oregon.
