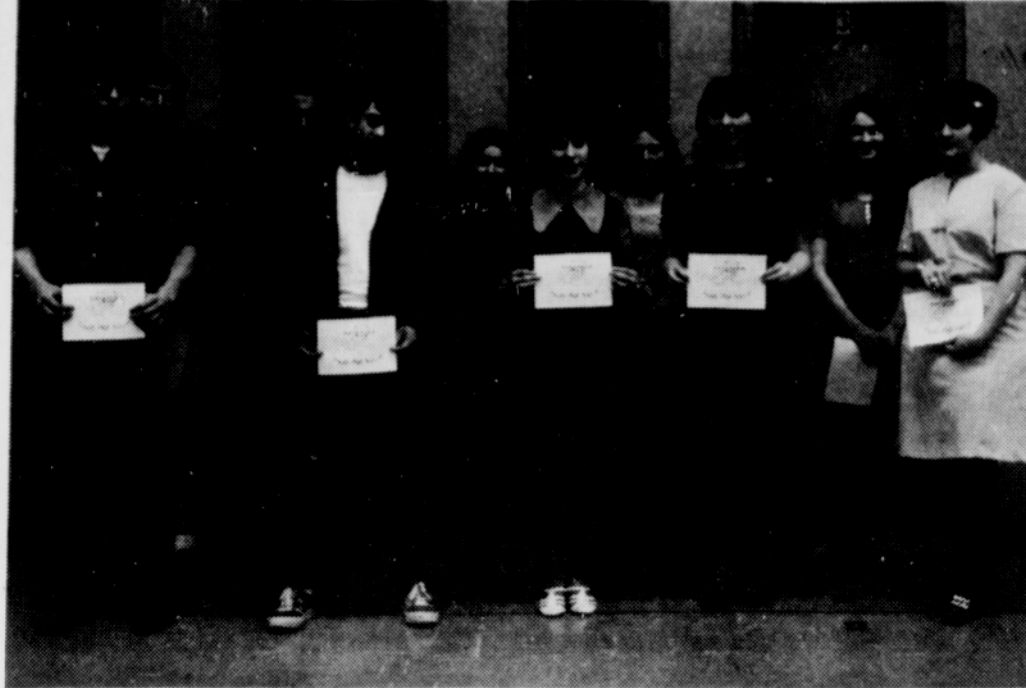

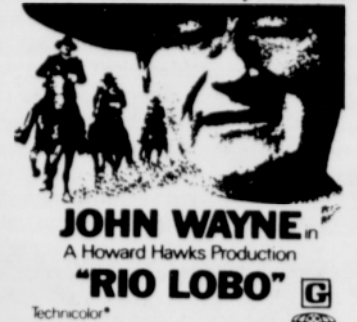

It is the proposed budget for 1971-72 school year not 1970-71 which we had printed on them. The budget itself was printed correctly.

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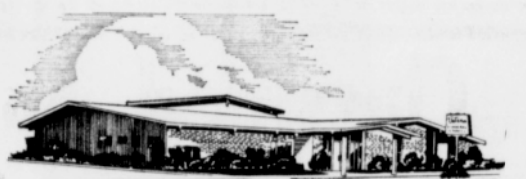
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Campsite reservation, information system to be run again this year

The State Highway Commission approved regulations which will permit the operation of the State Park Campsite Reservation and Information Systems for another season.

The systems, inaugurated on a trial basis last year to provide better services to campers, will operate basically as they did in 1970, but with some changes. In addition, two new parks have been added to the system and one dropped. Parks added were Harris Beach and Wallowa Lake, and dropped was Umpqua Lighthouse.

The reservation system, which permits a camper to make an advance reservation at one of the parks participating in the program, will begin operation on Monday, May 17, and will end on Sunday, September 5, 1971, and telephone service will not be available until that date.

Reservations may be made by all campers regardless of residence but only at the

specific parks participating in the program. The reservation request may be made by telephone, by letter, or in person, but it can be used only at the park where the request is made. Reservations cannot be transferred from one park to another. They cannot be made at a park not participating in the program, or at the main State Parks office, the District Parks offices, or through the Campsite Information Center.

Parks participating in the program this year are Beachside, Beverly Beach, Cape Lookout, Detroit Lake, Fort Stevens, Harris Beach, Honeyman, Prineville Reservoir, Sunset Bay, The Cove Palisades, and Wallowa Lake.

Another change in the system makes all campsites at the 11 designated parks available for reservation, but an advance reservation is not required to camp at one of these parks. Any campsite which has not been

reserved on any particular day, as well as reserved sites for which cancellations have been received, and any reserved sites which are not claimed by the designated check-in time will be available to campers arriving at a park without reservations on a first-come, first-served basis. Check-in time is 6 p.m. nightly, except for 9 p.m. on Fridays.

Reservations can be made at the designated parks during normal working hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. In addition, park personnel manning the registration-reservation booths will accept reservation requests during evening hours and on weekends if this task does not interfere with the registration of incoming campers. No waiting period is required between the time a reservation is made and when it can be utilized. A reservation can be made on the same day that it will be used.

Camping fees will remain the same for this season. These are \$3. per night for a trailer site and \$2 per night for an improved site. This year it will be possible to pay for the entire length of stay upon arrival at the park rather than daily payments as in the past.

In order to encourage people to cancel reservations they cannot use, cancellations can be made by calling the Campsite Information Center from any place in Oregon on a toll-free number. This information will then be relayed to the specified park and the site made available to someone else.

The primary function of the Campsite Information Center will be to provide current information on the availability of campsites in State Parks. The Center will answer questions about the reservation system, including where and how to make reservations, and how many reservations are available at a particular park. It will also provide information about State Park Facilities and activities. To a lesser extent, information on camping facilities operated by other agencies and general recreation information for tourist will be furnished. Campsite reservations cannot be made through this service.

The Campsite Information Service will begin operation on Monday, May 17, and close on Friday, September 3. The Center will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. It will be closed on weekends and holidays. The Center will be serviced by a toll-free number, and there is no charge for this service in Oregon.

Information on the Campsite Information Center toll-free number and on the telephone numbers of the parks participating in the program will be furnished at a later date.
