Dale Ira Guenther, 56, of 105 SE Hood St. Gresham, died April 28, at the Veterans Hospital in Portland.

He was born March 31, at Marysville, Kans., and at about the age of 8 he left Kansas with his family and moved into Oregon. They settled in Gresham.

He attended Gresham Grade School and graduated from Rockwood Grade School and from Gresham High School.

On Feb. 2, 1939 at Kelso, Wash. he married Virginia Maxon. On Oct. 25, 1944 at Seattle, Wash. he enlisted in the United States Navy, served in the Asiatic-Pacific campaign and was discharged on Jan. 31, 1946 at Bremerton, Wash. He was a Seaman First Class.

After returning to civilian life he became a driver salesman for the Clackamas Distributing Co. He was well known in the district east of Portland, and on the slopes of Mt. Hood, where his routes took him. He was in failing health for the past two years. He was a member of the Gresham Veterans of Foreign Wars.

The survivors include his wife, Virginia, of Gresham; a daughter Miss Carole Guenther of Redlands, Calif., a son Glynn Guenther of Gresham. Two sisters and one brother also survive: Mrs. George (Delma) Pullen of Gresham, Mrs. Mabel Browder of Sandy, and Fay Guenther of Gresham.

Funeral services were Monday, May 3, in the Chapel of Carroll Funeral Home, Gresham, with vault interment in Willamette National Cemetery.
