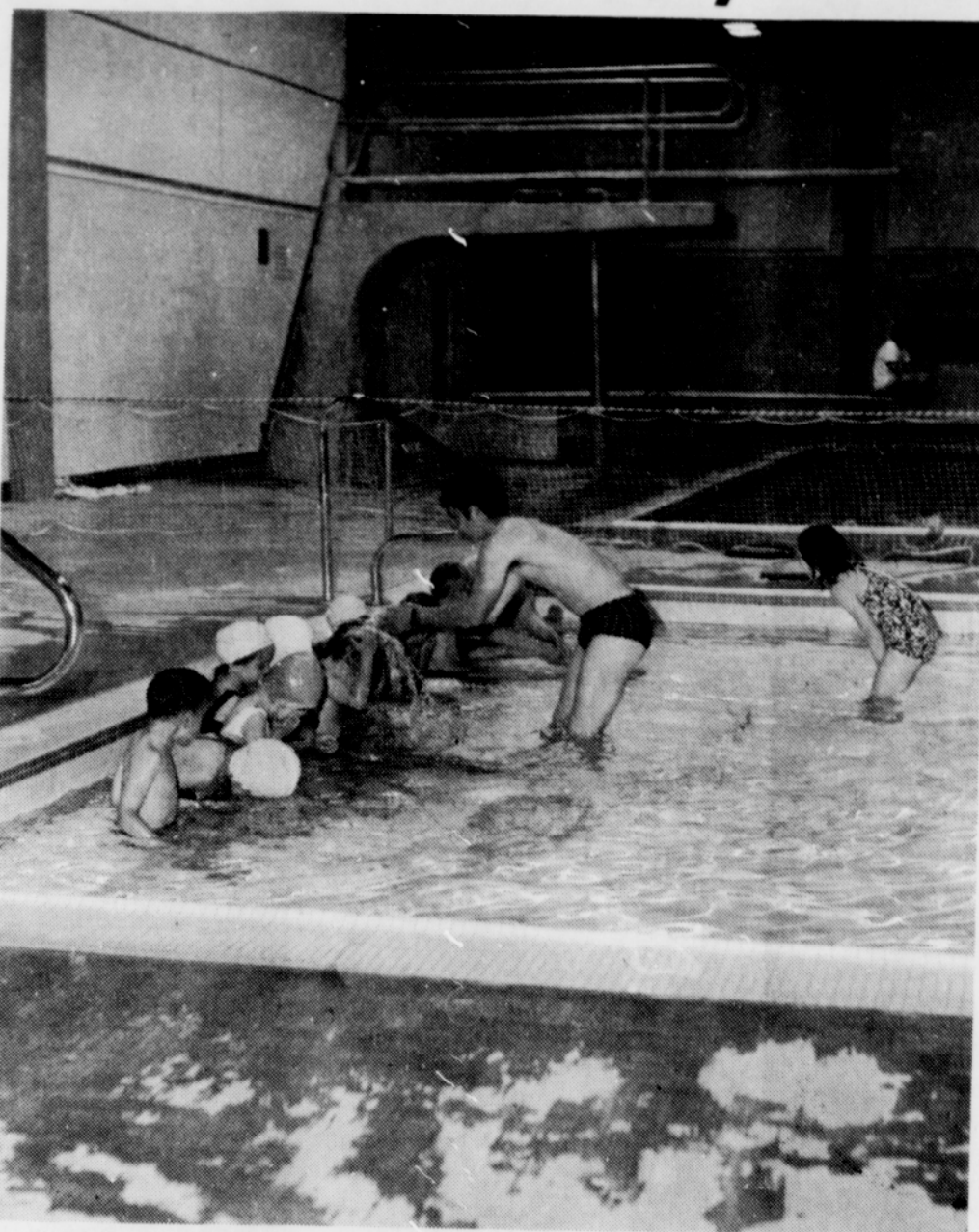
June 8 - Reynolds No. 1 at Sandy - Reynolds 30 - Sandy 6.

June 15 - Sandy at Lynch No. 2 - Lynch 17 - Sandy 3.

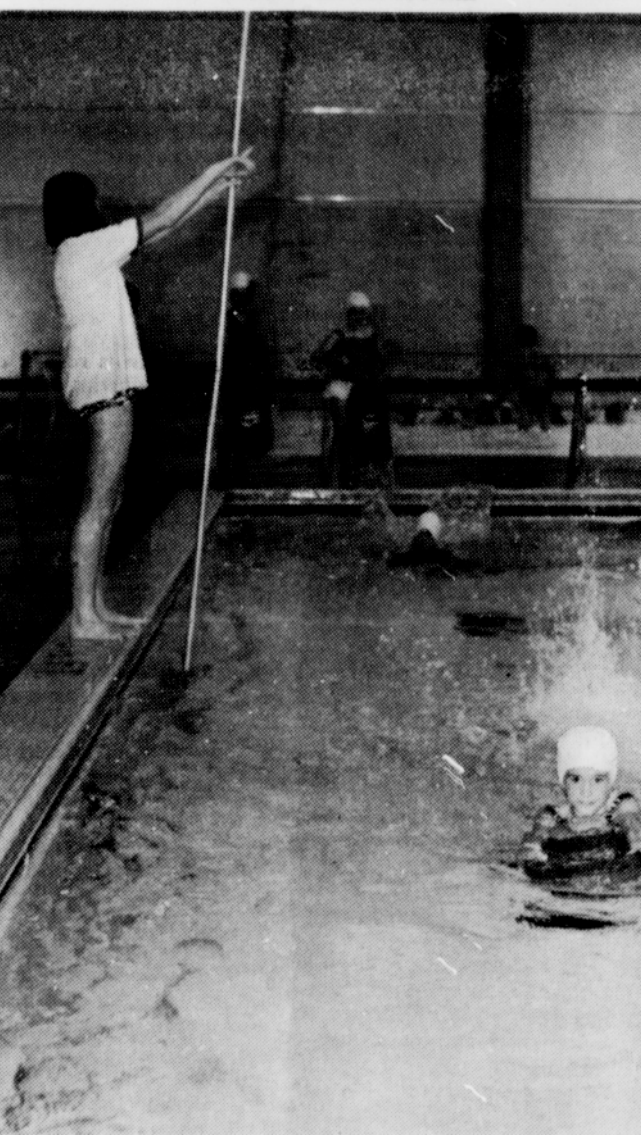
June 14 - Game with Rockwood forfeit to Sandy - Rockwood did not show.

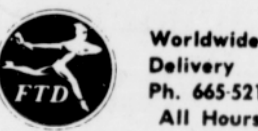
