Plants, animals should be left in own habitat

Don't be guilty of contributing to the extinction of a plant, bird or animal by dragging specimens home from your vacation this year. Living things should be left in their native habitat and you can bring them home on film, not dead or dying specimens. Cautions against being a wanton destroyer as you yield to the temptation for building collections are given by Wilbur W. Burkhardt, area extension agent. Many plants are poisonous and should not be handled unless they are known by the vacationer. Some cause severe skin irritation similar to poison oak infections while others secrete poisonous substances from stems and leaves. Handling plants prior to eating can cause severe illness if the plant has these poisonous properties. Berries from unknown plants should never be eaten and many a vacation has been cut short or ended in tragedy because someone tried to live off the land and was poisoned by toxic berries or mushrooms.

Animals frequently carry disease of serious nature when transmitted to humans. All wild animals, no matter how friendly, will resist capture or restriction and scratch or bite as a means of defense. If permitted, by local regulations, animals may be fed but never from the hand. Natural greed may prompt an animal to bite a hand or finger. Always place food where the animal can get it and then retreat to observe and photograph. Burkhardt suggests caution be exercised before bringing food items home unless the container is unopened. Aside from spoilage, some remote areas may offer foods that have been in stock for many months at the wayside store. Bringing these food items home will only infest your cupboard with unwanted kitchen insects. Cooperate with authorities. Agricultural inspections are for the purpose of preventing further spread of destructive insects and diseases. Don't threaten your plants and pets by sneaking

something past the inspectors. If you must bring home some living reminders of your happy vacation, be sure to get them from approved sources where they will have been inspected and packed in such a manner as to insure freedom from disease. As an added benefit, complete instructions for care of living things are usually included to make your efforts successful.

Houses need pre-vacation clean-up for good return

Anticipation of summer vacation events need not include the dread of returning home to find a shambles instead of the attractive home and grounds you left behind. Pre-vacation anxiety often omits some steps that would save the onset of many troubles while you are miles away enjoying the great outdoors. Preparations need to include some basic housekeeping chores completed in order that free-loading critters do not move in and select your house as permanent quarters while you are away.

"Critters" may be any one of all types insects. Ants, cockroaches, weevils, bran bugs, meal moths and clothes moths enjoy a good food supply and being left alone while they have their banquet celebrations of your absence. All they need for an invitation is a small bit of food here and there that escaped your attention before you headed for the open road. Suggestions for returning to a "critter-free" house are outlined by Wilbur W. Burkhardt, area extension agent. Jobs may be assigned to all members of the family to insure that all kinds of insect attractants have been removed. Toasters accumulate crumbs as do bread drawers and bins. Thorough cleaning of all bread and pastry containers removes a supply of food sufficient to keep a large family of insects well-fed for weeks. Clean up all spills of cereals, flour, corn meal and cereal products will complete the job. Ants like sugar, honey, jams,

jellies and any food with a sweet flavor or odor. Washing the cutter on the can opener, as well as all container tops to eliminate all residues of foodstuffs will leave the ants without food. Take all empty beverage bottles back to the grocers or leave them at the materials re-cycle plant before departure. Ovens and range heating elements need a thorough cleaning not only to prevent insect infestations but to put the joy back into meal preparation when clean utensils and equipment is used. Just before departure, empty the kitchen waste container and make sure the disposal is rinsed free of all food particles. Take all fruits with you to eat on the way. They will be dead-ripe or spoiled when you return and the insects will be the beneficiaries. For the yard and plants, carry out the usual maintenance operations making certain that you "deep water" the lawn, flower and shrub beds. At the same time apply

the final insecticide and fungicide sprays and arrange for the grass to be cut to keep the premises appearing "lived in as usual." Make a list of plants and garden operations that must be done frequently so you can give this to your helpful neighbor who is going to look after the premises. Shouting instructions from a car window as you depart puts an unfair burden on the helper who probably didn't get all the instructions you would have given if you had been better organized.

Now that you have arranged for deliveries of paper, milk and other automatic services to stop while you are gone, take time to notify the police of your absence and inform them of who will have access to your house. Finally, disconnect all unnecessary automatic electric appliances and arrange for lights to be turned on and off at night. Vary the lights to be used to give the impression you are home. For a flawless set of

instructions to your caretaker, leave instructions for the names of your plumber or other emergency service man if unforeseen trouble develops in your absence. Pre-vacation planning and work takes a little more time but pays huge dividends. You have no worries while on the road and you return to a sparkling clean home when the vacation trip has been finished. About 55 per cent of all American families keep pets, and the percentage is rising.
