

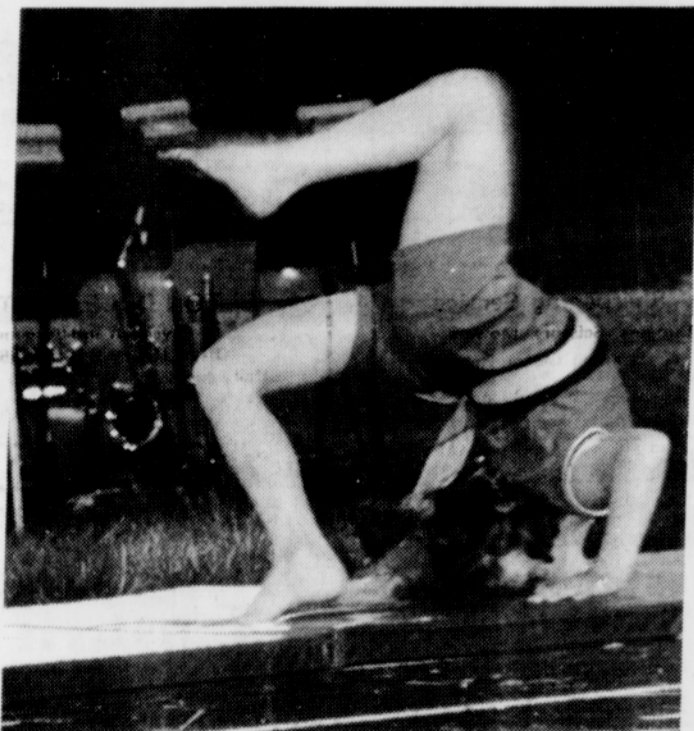
5,000 people watch Sandy fireworks

The July 4 celebration proved to be a huge success in Sandy with over 5,000 persons estimated to have attended.

The highlight of the day was the fireworks display which concluded the activities.

The celebration was sponsored by Sandy Civic Services (incorporated for non-profit). The organization has a board of directors composed of representatives from various civic organizations in the area.

The program of events started at 2 p.m. with a free show for children at the Sunset Theater and ended with the fireworks at about 11 p.m.

Included in the program this year were two baseball games, races by age groups, nickel in a haystack, waterball games between fire districts, talent show and the fireworks.

One event which did not take place was the parachute drop which was cancelled due to FAA regulations.

Overall the program ran smoothly, except that it ran about one half hour behind schedule, according to Gary Sandblast, chairman of this year's program.

The program took place at the high school athletic field and when the fireworks took place the grandstands and the hills surrounding the stands were filled with people.

The fireworks display cost in the excess of \$600. The money was raised through donations from civic groups and businesses in Sandy.

Sealed proposals will be received by the City of Sandy, Oregon until 8:00 P.M. on Monday, July 19, 1971 for the furnishing of 2 1/2' minus and 3/4' minus crushed rock at the time mentioned the proposal will be opened and publicly read at the City Hall, Sandy, Oregon.

All proposals shall be sealed and addressed "Proposal for furnishing rock", addressed or delivered to the City Recorder at the City Hall by mail or in person, said proposals to be on proposal blanks furnished in the specifications.

The successful bidder shall deliver to the job site on the end of Jarl Road and spread 2 1/2' minus crushed base rock and 3/4' minus crushed leveling rock as directed by the City Engineer on a graded roadway. All rock must meet the Oregon State Highway specifications for the appropriate size materials.

The successful bidder will be required to execute the contract within five days (5 days) after the award of the work to him and shall furnish a Public Contract Performance Bond in the amount of one hundred (100) percent of the amount of the bid to the City of Sandy, Oregon.

The rock shall be paid for on a truck load measure basis. It is estimated that the project will require some 600 yds. of 2 1/2' minus and 300 yds. of 3/4' minus.

The City reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive in formalities, or to award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder.
