

Wrestlers win matches, schedule gets tougher

The Sandy High School varsity and junior varsity wrestlers are off to a tremendous start this season with overwhelming wins in their first three dual matches.

The varsity crew dumped South Albany 49 to 18, Canby 39 to 17 and Astoria 39 to 19. The JV's meanwhile pinned the same opponents running up a 66 to 6 win over Canby and a 51 to 21 win over Astoria, besides dumping S. Albany.

The varsity team going into the match with Newberg on Tuesday night of this week had three men who were un-

defeated for the season. They are Pat Dyal at 130 lbs., Jim Bourn at 136 lbs. and Doug Harding at 178 lbs. All three have a 6-0 win record for the year so far.

They will host Molalla here on Friday night with the JV matches beginning at 6 p.m. and the varsity matches following.

"I am real pleased with the effort put out by all the wrestlers so far and hope that we can continue to do as well as the matches get tougher," said coach Ron Calhoun.

He stated that a highlight of

the recent wins was the victory over Canby which marked the first win by a Sandy wrestling team over them in 16 years.

Coach Calhoun said he was glad that the team had some of

the easier teams to wrestle first as starting with Newberg and Molalla matches this week the matches get tougher.

"The experience which our wrestlers got in these early

matches is going to be of tremendous help," said Calhoun. He pointed to the fact that of the 10 wins in the S. Albany match only four of the winners for Sandy were seniors

Newberg wrestlers end Pioneer win streak 32 to 19

The Pioneer wrestling team saw their three meet win streak ended Tuesday night as Newberg dropped Sandy 32 to 19.

The meet was a lot closer than the score showed as the Pioneers lead most of the way and trailed only 20 to 19 with two matches to go. In those two matches, Newberg wrestlers pinned both Sandy opponents to assure the visitors of the victory.

Coach Ron Calhoun was pleased with his team's performance, but was disappointed to see his team drop the match after successive wins over South Albany, Canby and Astoria.

Calhoun knew his varsity wrestlers were in for a tough match when the JV's fell to Newberg 42 to 18 prior to the varsity match.

Getting points for the JV team were Scott Hergert, Bob Carey, Ed Eggleston, and Mitch Eblen.

This also was the first dual meet loss for the JV's this season.

Going into the Newberg match Sandy had three undefeated wrestlers and now they have only two. Both Pat Dyal and Jim Bourn won by

decisions to keep their records clean. Both are now 7-0 for the season while Doug Harding was decided by his opponent for his first loss of the season. He now has a 6-1 record.

Other Sandy wrestlers getting wins in the match were Greg Jordan, Gene Delay, Mark Sherman and Steve Parker came up with a draw in his match.

The next match for the Pioneers is this Friday with Molalla here. The Indians look to be one of the tougher league opponents that Sandy will meet this year.

The match is set for a starting time of 6 p.m. for the JV team with the varsity competition to follow.

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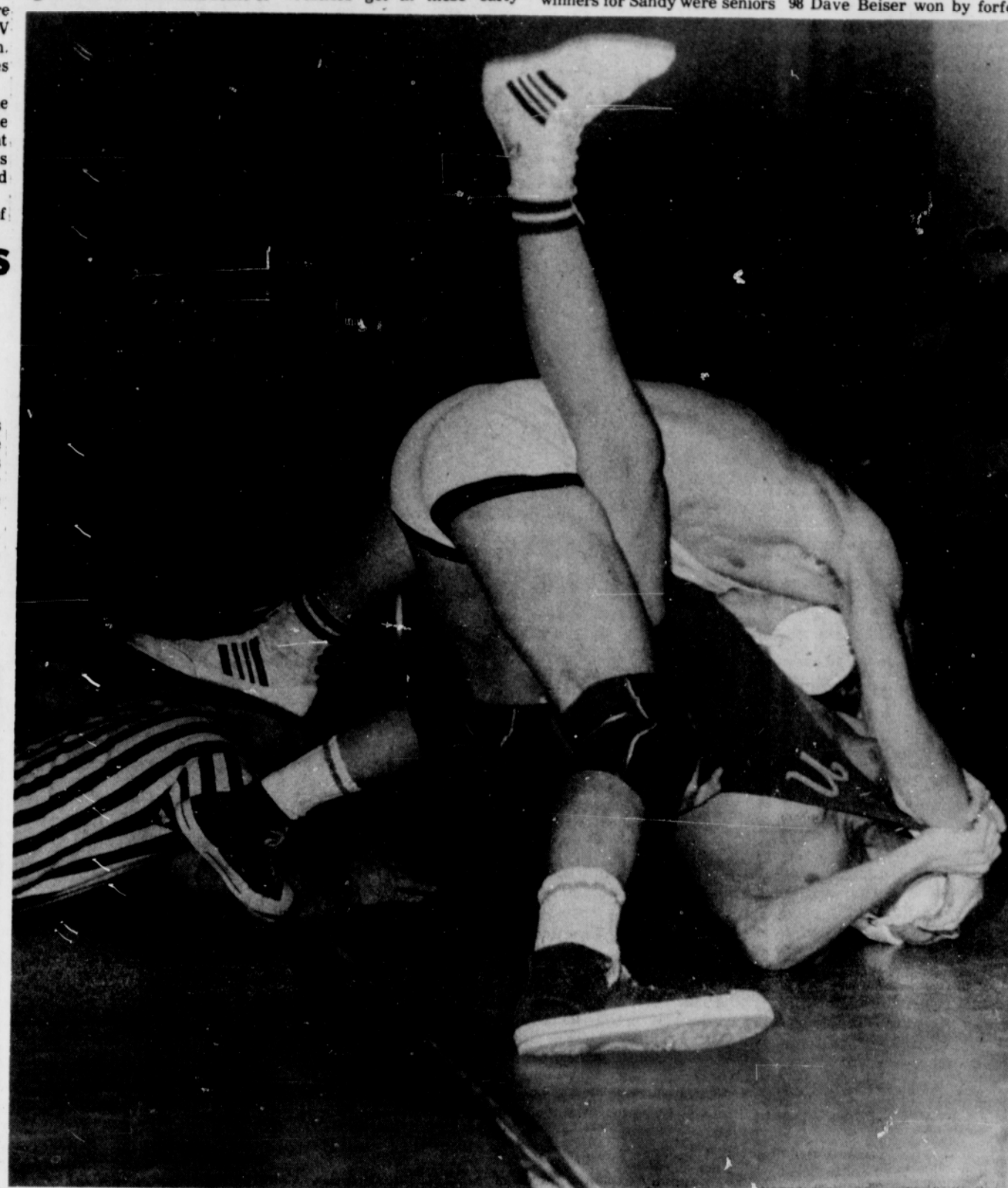
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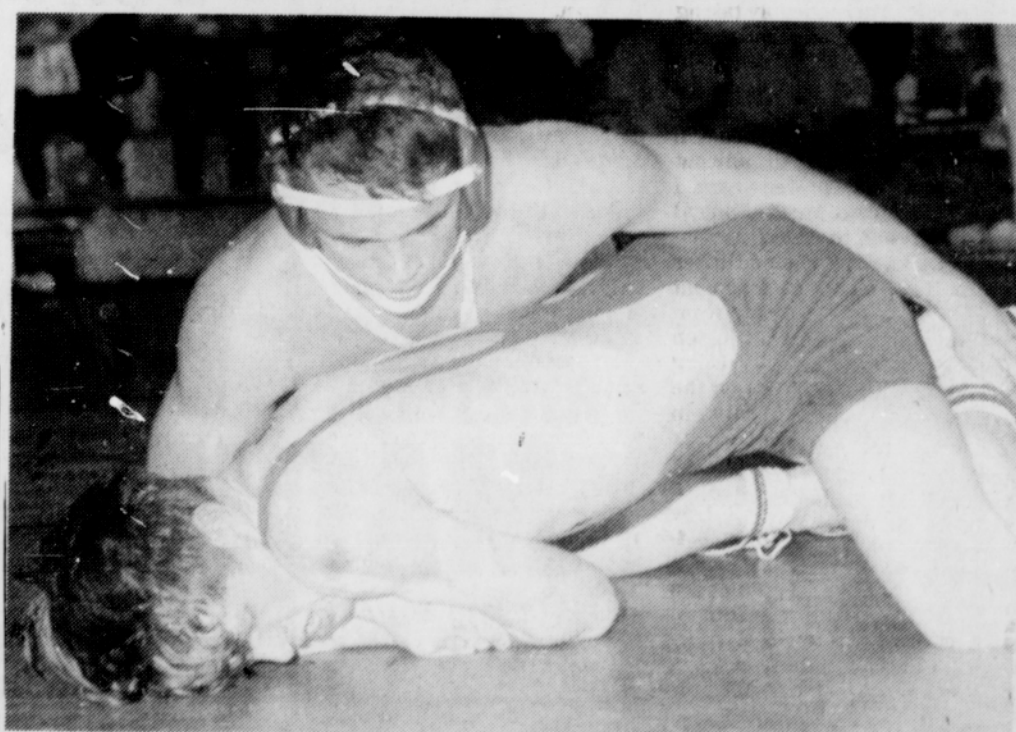

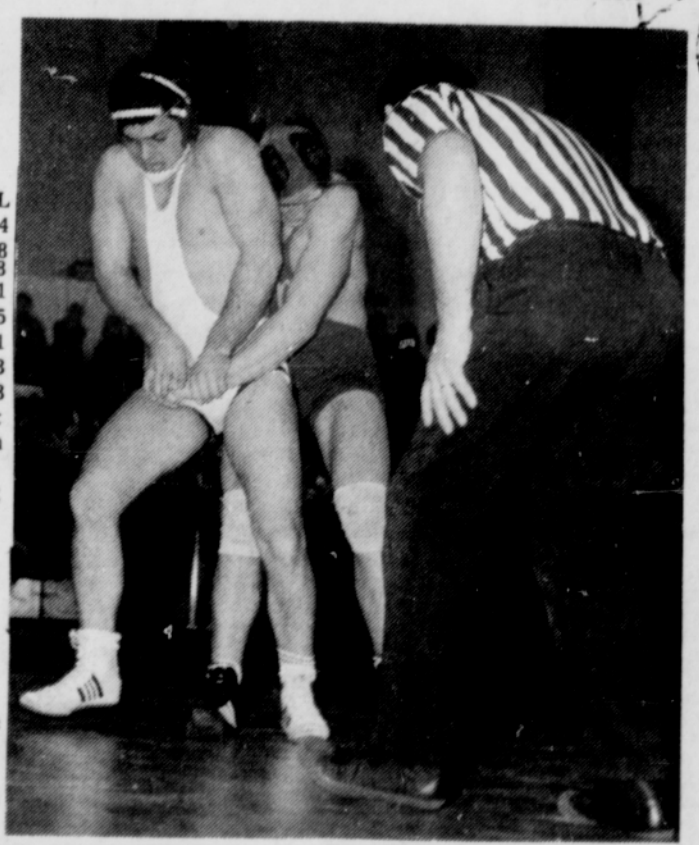
