

Pioneers get two wins, rank second in league

The Sandy Pioneer basketball team is in the middle of a fight for their division lead following a 60 to 49 win over Silverton Tuesday night. The win gives the Pioneers a 4-2 record in league play and second spot only one game

behind Estacada which has a 5-1 record. Coach Jim Kitchen saw his team win at Silverton with good defense as he did earlier in the week when they beat Forest Grove 78 to 36. "We have been playing good

defense all year, but only in the last two wins have we been able to get some points of our own on defense," said Kitchen. In the Forest Grove game, the Pioneers moved to a 36 to 15 halftime lead and never were headed again.

In the first half the scoring of senior guard Pat Sutton and the board work and defense of the whole team spelled the difference. Most of the starters played only about half of the game giving all the players on the

team a chance to see lots of action. In the second half, the Sandy offense was led by Dean Dickenson who hit for a game high 17 points. Kitchen was very pleased with the play of junior guard

Ralph Petersen who started for the first time. He ended the game with 8 points but added 9 rebounds to the team total of 47 for the game. Scoring for Sandy in the Forest Grove game were Dickenson 17, Nippert 9, Sutton

14, Leary 2, Peterson 8, Perkins 7, Zimmerman 10, Stockum 1, and Turin 10. Next action for the varsity is Friday home against Sweet Home and Tuesday here against McMinnville.

SH is 2-3 in league play but lost only by two points 59 to 57 to Estacada Tuesday night. Meanwhile the Sandy JV's have picked up wins in their last three games. They beat Estacada 75 to 70, Molalla 65 to 43 and Forest Grove 64 to 62. Scoring for the JV's in these games have been Blount 23, Konell 34, Nippert 25, Baughman 39, Bryant 30, Jackson 13, Dahrens 6, Moody 12, Schwartz 9.

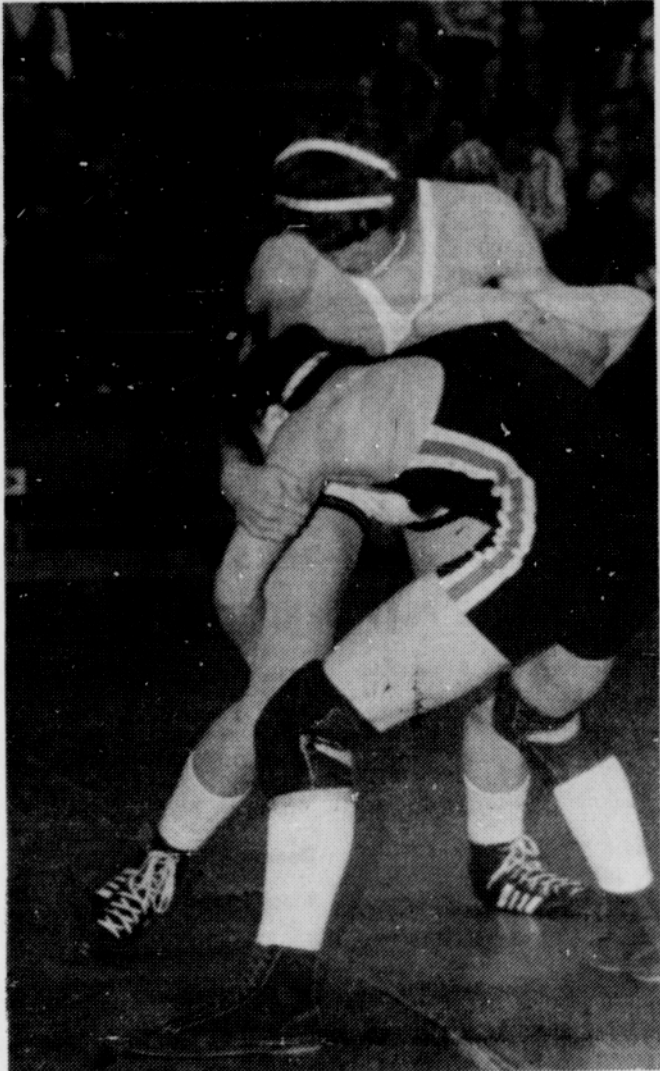

He had been 10-0 going into his match, but in this match he met a Silverton man who had a 16-0 record so far this season. In the tournament at Forest Grove the Pioneers got 109 points to finish second to

Gresham who had 154 points. Other teams at the meet and their scores were Forest Grove 84 and Central 37. Coach Ron Calhoun stated that his young team has been doing well this season overall, but they are getting beat on mistakes which only ex-

perience can teach. In the tournament Sandy had five champions, they were Gene DeLay 123 lbs., Pat Dyal 130 lbs., Jim Bourn 136 lbs., Mark Sherman 168 lbs. and Jerry Stratton 178 lbs. Sherman actually was a co-champion in his weight

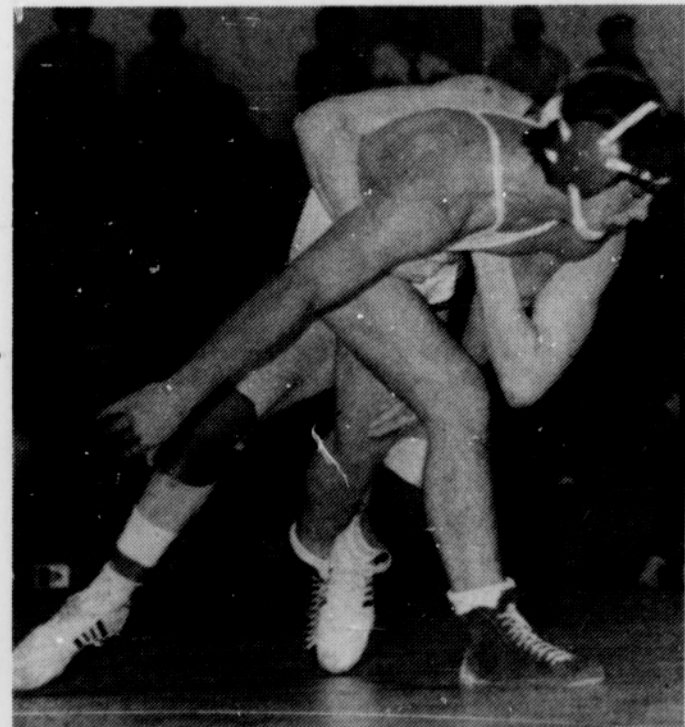
division. In dual meet competition in this tournament Sandy beat Forest Grove 36 to 19, Central 54 to 10 and lost to Gresham 41 to 16. The JV team also went to the meet with three wrestlers getting championships. They

were Rich Richardson, Eric Lundeen, Jeff Chaney. Chaney won his division with two pins, each in less than a minute of action. The team travels to Woodburn for a tournament in freestyle wrestling this weekend.

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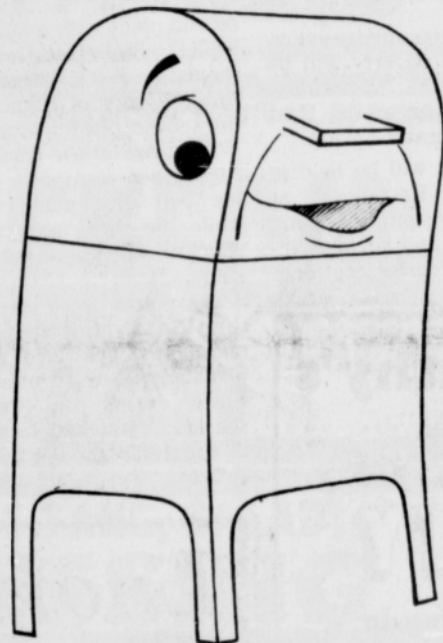
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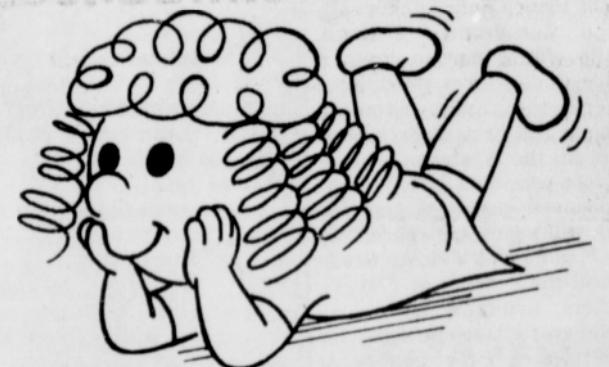
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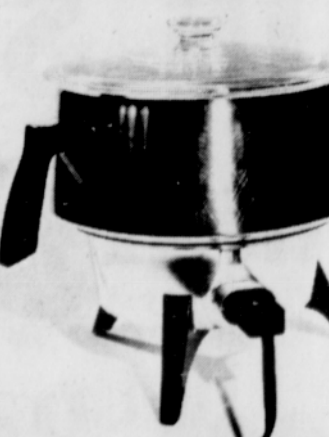
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
