

Jackpot riding finals scheduled

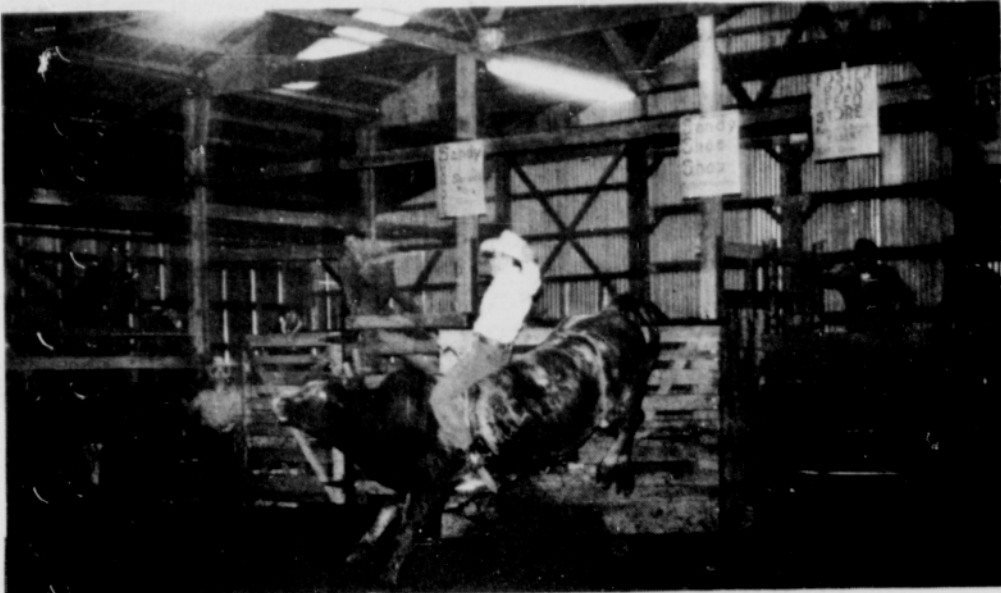
A big weekend is coming up at the New Bar 2 Arena at Eagle Creek. This will be the finals in the Winter Jackpot bull and bareback riding.

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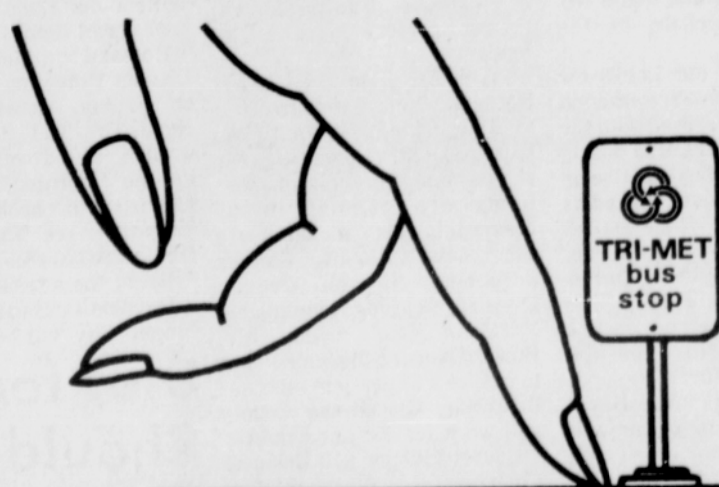
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
