The bride wore a floor-length dress of white satin with an empire waist. Her veil was a white long net with lace beaded crown. She carried white orchids on top of a Bible with

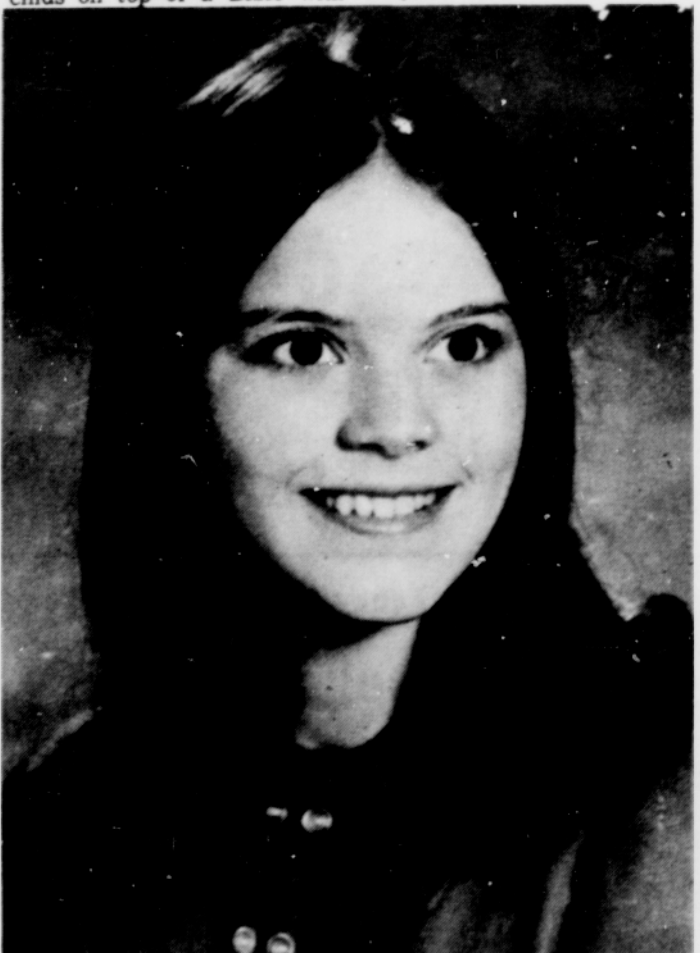
white ribbons.
