Top skiers race

Wins pool tournament

One hundred and thirty-five skiers, including nearly the entire U.S. and Canadian national teams were entered in the Mountain Bells Giant Slalom held at Mt. Hood Meadows on Tuesday, an internationally sanctioned event.

The three Cochran sisters and their brother from Richmond, Vt., were included in the entry list. The family, considered the world's leading skiing family, is headed by Barbara Ann, who won a gold medal in the slalom event during the recent Winter Olympic Games in Sapporo, Japan.

Included among the local champions were Mike Lafferty of Eugene, America's top placer in the 1972 World Cup, and Don Rowles of Sandy, who took the combined title in the Can-Am circuit this winter.

Several Japanese and Scottish skiers were entered, along with one Norwegian and a skier who once represented India in Olympic competition.
