Storm damage small in county

A Boring airplane hanger was East County's only casualty last Wednesday, when strong winds whipped through the metropolitan area and killed six people in Vancouver.

The mid-afternoon winds demolished a new, \$15,000 hangar near Boring, but caused only \$400-\$500 damage to the airplane stored inside.

The 30 by 40-foot structure

was "Nothing but firewood" according to owner George Cushman, who sped to the site from his Portland insurance office after neighbors called to tell him the building had been destroyed.

Portland General Electric spokesman Frank Smith said approximately 2,000 customers served by the Hogan, Rockwood and Glendoveer substations lost their power for about two hours, when those entire feeder systems went out.

Homes as far east as Estacada were without electricity somewhat longer, but Smith said repair work on numerous individual home lines had been completed by nightfall.

Fire District 10, Boring Fire Department and Multnomah County Sheriff's spokesmen said they answered no local emergency storm-caused calls in the Gresham area, except for a few downed power lines.

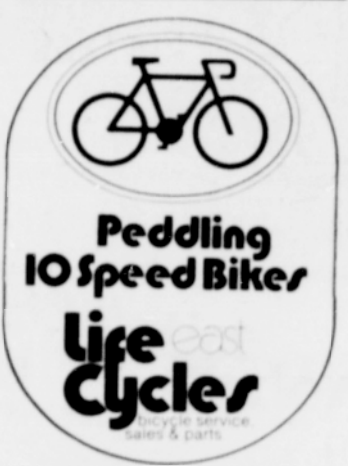
