The list of 1972 graduates includes 524 who will receive bachelor degrees in education, 130 bachelor degrees in general

studies and 196 master degrees. Students listed as graduating with honors have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or better.

State Representative Norma Paulus, R-Salem, will speak at the program which will begin at 2 p.m. at the college stadium. If it rains, the ceremony will be moved into the new Physical Education building nearby. The number of degrees is the largest ever conferred by OCE in a year.

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
